And notice is hereby given that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statutes.

WINCHESTER COLLEGE.

THE NUMBER OF THE SCHOLARS OF THE COLLEGE AND MATTERS RELATING TO ELECTIONS TO SCHOLARSHIPS AND TO THE CANCELLING OF ELECTION ROLLS.

WE, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the

powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:—

A Statute for amending Section 1 and Section 6 of Statute XI of the Statutes of Winchester College approved by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council the 24th day of October, 1904.

1. Section 1 of the said Statute XI shall be amended so that, as amended, it shall stand and be read as follows:—

“ 1.—Subject to the provisions of Section 6 of this Statute, there shall be not less than seventy Scholars of the College to be elected by the Warden and Fellows in manner hereinafter provided.”

2. Section 6 of the said Statute XI shall be amended so that, as amended, it shall stand and be read as follows:—

“ 6.—On the day of election in every year, the Warden and Fellows shall arrange on a roll in order of merit the names of at least as many candidates as shall in their judgment be sufficient to supply vacancies. Every vacancy among the Scholars existing on the day of election or occurring before the day on which the roll is to be deemed to be cancelled shall be filled up from and according to the order of the names on the roll. Subject as hereinafter provided, the roll shall be deemed to be cancelled on the first day of the Lent Term next after the election. But at any time, either before or after the last-mentioned day, the Warden and Fellows may, if they think fit, direct that the roll shall be deemed to be, and to have at all times been, operative, and of full force and effect, until the first day of the Summer Term next after the election; and in the event of their so directing, the roll shall be deemed to be cancelled on and not before the day last mentioned. No candidate shall, by reason of his name having appeared on a cancelled roll, have any claim to preference for election.”

3. In the amendment hereinbefore made to Section 1 of the said Statute XI, the words “ Section 6 of this Statute ” shall be deemed to refer to and mean the said Section 6 as the same stands amended by this present Statute.

4. In any future print of the said Statute XI, Sections 1 and 6 thereof may be printed as they stand amended by this present Statute.

5. This Statute shall come into force immediately upon the approval thereof by His Majesty the King in Council: Provided that nothing in this Statute shall affect any election to Scholarships made, or any election roll issued, before the date of such approval.

SUPERANNUATION ALLOWANCES OR GRATUITIES FOR MASTERS AND DEATH GRATUITIES FOR THEIR LEGAL PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVES OR DEPENDANTS.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Rural District Council of Chepstow are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Rural District Council of Chepstow intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.
