Greeting:

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did by Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the tenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred, in the sixty-third year of Her Reign, institute and create a decoration to be styled "The Kaisar-i-Hind Medal for Public Service in India," and did make certain Rules and Ordinances for the government of the same:

And whereas by the said Royal Warrant power was reserved to Us of annulling and altering the said Rules and Ordinances or any part thereof by a Notification under Our Royal Sign Manual:

And whereas alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances were made by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one and by His late Majesty King George the Fifth by Warrants under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve and the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three:

And whereas We desire to make certain further alterations and amendments in the said Rules and Ordinances:

Now Know Ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, make the following alterations and amendments, in the said Rules and Ordinances, that is to say:—

1. For the Fifth Rule the following shall be substituted: "Fifthly—It is ordained that awards of the Medal of the Second and Third Class shall be made by Our Viceroy for the time being"

2. In the Seventh Rule, for the words "in the Gazette of the Local Government" shall be substituted the words "in the Gazette of the Provincial Government" and for the words "in the Office of the Foreign and Political Department of the Government of India" shall be substituted the words "by such person as Our Viceroy may direct"

3. In the Ninth Rule and the proviso thereto the words "and Governor-General of India" shall be deleted.

Now know ye that we do, by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, make the following amendments in the said Rules, that is to say:—

1. In the preamble to the said Rules for the words "Our Viceroy and Governor-General of India" shall be substituted the words "Our Viceroy."

2. In the Fourth Rule for the words "in the Office of the Home Department of the Government of India" shall be substituted the words "by such person as Our Viceroy may direct."

3. To the Sixth Rule there shall be added the words "and for each bar awarded a small silver rose shall be added to the riband when worn alone."

4. In the Eighth Rule for the words "Our Viceroy and Governor-General of India" and "Our said Viceroy and Governor-General" shall be substituted in each case the words "Our Viceroy."

5. In the Ninth Rule for the words "Our Viceroy and Governor-General of India" shall be substituted the words "Our Viceroy."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th July, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt

Act, 1889, and the War Loans Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th July, 1938, to Saturday, the 16th July, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

1. *Bread, Flour Confectionery and Sausage Manufacture (Commencement of Employment) Regulations*, allowing the special exception, as to the commencement of the period of employment contained in section 83 of the Act, to

factories in which is carried on the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery (including meat and fruit pies) or sausages.

2. *Bread, Flour Confectionery and Sausage Manufacture (Overtime) Regulations*, modifying the provisions of section 73 of the Act as to overtime, to meet seasonal or other special pressure of work.
