1. *Factory Overtime (Separation of Different Parts or Sets) Regulations, 1938*, prescribing under Section 73 (8) of the Act, conditions subject to which employment in different parts of a factory, or the employment of different sets of persons in different processes, may be treated, for the purpose of reckoning overtime, as if it were employment in different factories.

2. *Operations at Unfenced Machinery Regulations, 1938*, specifying under Sections 15 and 16 of the Act conditions under which certain operations may be carried out at unfenced machinery. These Regulations will come into force on the 1st August, 1938.

## FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 30th June, 1938, he made an Order under Subsection (2) of Section 160 of the Factories Act, 1937, postponing from the 1st July, 1938, until the 1st January, 1940, the coming into operation of certain requirements of the Act in certain cases, namely:—

1. The requirement contained in Subsection (2) of Section 13 of the said Act as respects

factories in which the main transmission machinery is driven wholly or partly by water power.

2. The requirements contained in Subsections (3), (4), (5) and (7) of Section 22 of the Act as respects hoists or lifts constructed or reconstructed before the passing of the Act in warehouses to which the provisions of Section 22 are applied by Subsection (3) of Section 105 of the Act, subject to the condition that the hoist or lift shall be securely fenced so far as is reasonably practicable.

#### COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 29th day of June, 1938, the Board of Trade made General Regulations for Quarries under the powers conferred by Section 86 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, as applied to quarries by the Factories Act, 1937.

The Regulations, which are operative from 1st July, 1938, are divided into six parts.

Part I. requires notice to be given to His Majesty's Inspectors of the opening and closing of quarries, lays down general requirements for the safe working of quarries, and defines in general terms the respective duties of the Owner, the Agent or Manager and the persons employed.

Part II. deals with health and welfare, and includes requirements with regard to first-aid; sanitary, messing and changing accommodation; and the suppression of dust which may be injurious to health.

Part III. deals with the employment of women and of young persons under sixteen years of age, and, as required by Section 158 (3) of the Factories Act, 1937, applies without change the provisions of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, relative to the employment of women and young persons above ground.

Part IV. regulates the use of machinery and plant and contains provisions about the cleaning, oiling and fencing of machinery, the use of cranes and other lifting machines, the care and maintenance of chains, ropes, etc., and the use of steam boilers and compressed air receivers.

Part V. is a code of rules, substantially the same as those already applying at coal mines and factories, to provide for the safe working of railway lines and sidings of standard gauge.

Part VI. prescribes the date on which the Regulations are to come into force and directs that they shall be in addition to and not in diminution of the provisions of Special Rules.

#### FIRST-AID.

The Order, which comes into force on 1st July, 1938, prescribes the minimum contents of the first-aid boxes or cupboards required to be provided and maintained at quarries.

### COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 30th day of June, 1938, the Board of Trade made General Regulations for Metalliferous Mines under the powers conferred by Section 86 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, as applied to metalliferous mines by the Mining Industry Act, 1920.

The Regulations, which are in six parts, are operative from 1st July, 1938, except as otherwise provided.

Part I contains general safety provisions covering shafts and outlets, duties of winding enginemen and banksmen, ventilation, water dangers, travelling roads and working places, haulage, safety lamps and inflammable and noxious gases, fire precautions, notice of working of the mine, and the duties of Owners, Agents, Officials and persons employed. The use of explosives, and lines and sidings of standard gauge, are left to be dealt with by special rules, as hitherto.

Part II deals with health and welfare, and includes requirements with regard to first-aid; sanitary, messing and changing accommodation; lighting (at shafts and on the surface); and the suppression of dust which may be injurious to health.

Part III deals with the employment of women and young persons under sixteen years of age, and as required by Section 158 (3) of the Factories Act, 1937, applies without change the provisions of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, relative to the employment of women and young persons above ground.

Part IV regulates the use of machinery and plant and contains provisions about the cleaning, oiling and fencing of machinery, the use of internal combustion engines below ground, the use of cranes and other lifting machines, the care and maintenance of chains and ropes, and the use of steam boilers, compressed air receivers and winding apparatus.

Part V deals with the use of electricity above and below ground and will be in substitution for the special rules, which apply mainly below ground, and for the Electricity Regulations under the Factory Acts, which at present apply above ground. The new requirements relating to the construction of cables and other electrical apparatus will not, in general, apply below ground until 1st July, 1941, and above ground until 1st July, 1945, to any cable or apparatus which was lawfully in use before 1st July, 1938.

Part VI prescribes the date on which the Regulations are to come into force and directs that they shall be in addition to and not in diminution of the provisions of Special Rules.

#### COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

#### THE WARWICKSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 22 of the Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 30th day of June, 1938, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended as follows:—

1. There shall be added to Clause 8 of the Scheme after paragraph (iii) thereof the following paragraph:—

“(iii) If at any time after the 31st day of July 1936—(a) a new colliery shall have been or shall be opened, or (b) the working of any

colliery not being part of a colliery undertaking shall have been or shall be recommenced following any abandonment or discontinuance of working and in the opinion of the Board the circumstances of the coal mine comprising that colliery make it unfair or inappropriate that an annual standard tonnage in respect of output of coal should be determined therefor the Board shall from time to time determine the standard tonnage in respect of output of coal of such coal mine for each month or quarter. The Board shall determine the annual standard tonnage in respect of output of coal of such coal mine when in their opinion such determination can fairly be made, and thereupon if such coal mine forms part of a colliery undertaking, the standard tonnage so determined shall be added to the annual standard tonnage in respect of output of coal of the other part of that undertaking. For the purposes of this Clause, "colliery" means a shaft or shafts adit or adits with the equipment and development necessary for getting and drawing coal and "new colliery" means a colliery from which coal has not been gotten or drawn save incidentally to the process of development."

2. There shall be added to Clause 8 of the Scheme after paragraph (vii) thereof the following paragraph:—

"(viiia) The provisions of paragraph (iiia) of this Clause shall apply with the necessary modifications to the determination of standard tonnages in respect of coal or any class of coal for export supply."

3. In paragraph (xiv) of Clause 8 before the word "standard" wherever that word occurs there shall be inserted the word "annual".

4. In Clause 9 at the end of paragraph (iv) there shall be added the following words—

"other than any tonnage relating to a coal mine of which the standard tonnages are determined under paragraphs (iiia) and (viiia) of Clause 8".

5. There shall be substituted for paragraph (ix) of Clause 11 of the Scheme the following paragraph:—

"(ix) If at any time after the 31st day of July, 1936, (a) a new colliery shall have been or shall be opened, or (b) the working of any colliery not being part of a colliery undertaking shall have been or shall be recommenced following any abandonment or discontinuance of working the Board shall determine the basic tonnage of the coal mine comprising the colliery having regard to the development of the colliery and all other relevant circumstances and to the interests of the other owners. Such basic tonnage shall be the annual basic tonnage of the coal mine save that for any period during which in the opinion of the Board the circumstances of that coal mine make it unfair or inappropriate that an annual basic tonnage should be determined therefor the Board may from time to time determine the basic tonnage of that coal mine for each month or quarter having regard to the matters aforesaid. If such coal mine forms part of a colliery undertaking the annual basic tonnage thereof when first determined shall be added to the annual basic tonnage of the other part of that undertaking. Any annual basic tonnage determined under this paragraph shall be

reviewed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (vi) of this Clause. For the purpose of this Clause the expressions 'colliery' and 'new colliery' shall have the same meanings respectively as are attached thereto under and for the purposes of paragraph (iiia) of Clause 8 of the Scheme."

6. In paragraphs (xii) (xiii) and (xiv) of Clause 11 the word "annual" shall be omitted.

7. There shall be substituted for the second proviso to paragraph (ii) of Clause 16B of the Scheme the following provision:—

"(iia) Any tonnage in respect of which no compensation is payable under the provisions of the last preceding paragraph shall be divided in proportion to the respective basic tonnages for that month or quarter of the coal mines other than those which having so supplied in that month or quarter a tonnage of coal less than their respective trade shares for that month or quarter are not entitled to the compensation in respect of the whole of the deficiency by virtue of the provisions of the last preceding paragraph.
