PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Neville, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“ I, Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

There is in the County of Dorset and my Diocese of Salisbury the Rectory or Benefice of Corfe Mullen, the Parish whereof contains a population of 1304 or thereabouts (according to the Census of 1931) with accommodation in the Parish Church for 343 persons.

That a portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Corfe Mullen is known as ‘ the Upton portion of Corfe Mullen ’ and is distant from the Parish Church of Corfe Mullen about five miles.

That the said Upton portion of the Parish of Corfe Mullen was transferred to the Parish of Lytchett Minster for civil purposes under the ‘ Lytchett Minster and Corfe Mullen Order, 1929 ’.

That the said Upton portion of the Parish of Corfe Mullen is distant from the Parish Church of Lytchett Minster about two-and-a-half miles.

The net annual value of the said Benefice of Corfe Mullen is £378 or thereabouts.

There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Lytchett Minster the Parish whereof contains a population of 1317 or thereabouts (according to the Census of 1931) with accommodation in the Parish Church for 350 persons.

That within the ecclesiastical parish of Lytchett Minster in addition to the Parish Church is a small Church known as Upton Church distant half-a-mile from the said Upton portion of Corfe Mullen.

The net annual value of the said Benefice of Lytchett Minster is £375 or thereabouts.

That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, all that portion of the Parish of Corfe Mullen known as the Upton portion of Corfe Mullen (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the map attached to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and thereon coloured pink) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Corfe Mullen and annexed to the Parish of Lytchett Minster to which it is contiguous.

I, Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, by virtue of my Bishopric am the patron of both the Benefices of Corfe Mullen and Lytchett Minster, the Reverend Ernest Clement Eddrup, Master of Arts, Canon of the Cathedral Church of Salisbury being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Corfe Mullen, and the Reverend Alfred Edward Nedham, Master of Arts, being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Lytchett Minster.

Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralities Act I the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a

Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of me as Patron of the Benefices of Corfe Mullen and Lytchett Minster and also the consents of the Incumbents of the Benefices of Corfe Mullen and Lytchett Minster to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Corfe Mullen and annex to the Parish of Lytchett Minster all that portion of the Parish of Corfe Mullen known as the Upton portion of Corfe Mullen, the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink.

That the Incumbent of Lytchett Minster shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within that portion of the Parish of Corfe Mullen so to be separated from Corfe Mullen and annexed to Lytchett Minster.

That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Lytchett Minster but shall cease to be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Corfe Mullen except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew in the said Parish Church of Corfe Mullen and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the said Parish Church of Lytchett Minster as they might have had in the Parish Church of Corfe Mullen.

That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Corfe Mullen shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of Lytchett Minster.

That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

CONSENTS.

We, Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, by virtue of my Bishopric the patron or person entitled to present or collate to both the Benefices of Corfe Mullen and Lytchett Minster (if the same or either of them were now vacant) and the Reverend Ernest Clement Eddrup the Incumbent of the Benefice of Corfe Mullen and the Reverend Alfred Edward Nedham the Incumbent of the Benefice of Lytchett Minster do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our

consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.
