(b) to the northward of the parallel of latitude 64° north and to the eastward of the meridian of the North Cape of Norway (longitude $25^{\circ} 47' 20''$ east).

5. To make provision as to the declaration by the Council of the calorific value or values of the gas to be supplied by them and the alteration from time to time of such calorific value or values and to make provision as to the pressure of the gas to be supplied by the Council.

6. To provide that the Council shall (except as otherwise specified) charge for gas supplied by them according to the number of heat units contained therein and to make provisions as to the method of ascertaining the number of heat units supplied.

7. To provide that certain of the provisions of the intended Order shall have effect as if they were contained in an Order made under Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

8. To fix the price or prices for the gas to be supplied by the Council within the limits of supply.

9. To confer powers upon the Council in connection with their gas undertaking including particularly provisions empowering the Council to open and break up streets forming the boundary of their limits for the supply of gas for the purpose of supplying gas to owners and occupiers of premises within those limits abutting on such streets; the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes; for preventing improper

use of gas; the exemption from obligation to supply gas in certain circumstances to be specified in the Order; as to the construction and placing of pipes, etc., power to compel repairs in case of danger; the position and inspecting and testing of meters and to specify by whom charges for testing of meters in certain cases are to be borne; charges for special reading of meters; the supply of gas fittings, etc., by the Council and the exemption thereof from distress, etc.; notice to be given in respect of discontinuance of a supply of gas; the service of gas demand notes and the recovery of charges in respect of fittings and apparatus summarily.

10. To authorise the Council to borrow money for the purposes of the Order or their gas undertaking and for the costs charges and expenses of the Order; to make provisions in regard to the receipts and expenses and the application of the revenue of the undertaking, the keeping of accounts, the application of surplus revenue, the formation of a reserve fund and as to the use of moneys forming part of such fund and of sinking funds.

11. To enable the Council to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Order and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas.

12. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.
