"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 29th day of February, 1908, the 17th day of May, 1920, the 11th day of October, 1923, and the 29th day of March, 1935, certain changes were sanctioned in the non-substantive Gunnery ratings held by Petty Officers and seamen of the Royal Navy and by Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Marines:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is necessary to introduce a further re-organisation of the Gunnery Branch and to sub-divide it into four sections for duties in connection with charge of quarters, fire control, gun and director laying and anti-aircraft gunnery, with three grades in each section, in addition to the existing rates of Gunner's Mate and Gunnery Instructor, Royal Marines, and that of seamen and Royal Marines qualified in ordnance work:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the new ratings as shown in the subjoined table, with effect from a date to be determined by us, with the revised daily rates of non-substantive pay specified:—

the four sections being termed control, layer, quarters and anti-aircraft respectively.

"We further propose that men holding the existing rates of Director Layer, Gunlayer, Rangetaker, Captain of Gun, Turret Trainer, Turret Director Trainer, Seaman Gunner, and Royal Marine qualified in Gunnery shall be transferred to the new ratings and grades in such manner as we direct, the old system ratings and allowances aforementioned being abolished in due course.

"And whereas we consider it desirable that certain of the rates of pay laid down in the above mentioned Orders in Council be revised:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise increased rates of pay for Sergeants and Constables in the Royal Marine Police Force, as set out hereunder, with effect from the 11th day of May,

For Sergeants—

8s. 6d. a day for the first two years of service in that rank.

9s. od. a day thereafter.

For Constables-

6s. 8d. a day for two years on probation.

7s. od. a day after two years' service, subject to proficiency.

7s. 3d. a day after three years' service. 7s. 6d. a day after four years' service.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 36 & 37 Vict. c. 60; 58 & 59 Vict. c. 33; 6 Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugi-

tive criminals:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 15th day of October, 1935, between His late Majesty King George V. and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland for the mutual extradition of criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Denmark (Extradition) Order in Council, 1936, and are as follows:-

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty the King and Emperor), and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland,

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the

Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Commander Henry Fitzhardinge Berkeley Maxse, His Chargé d'Affaires ad interim in Copenhagen;

His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland:

For Denmark:

His Prime Minister Thorvald August Marinus Stauning, Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:-

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:-

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland on the one hand, that is to say, Denmark and Danish colonies, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty the King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty the King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article I shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, on the one hand, and on the other the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty the King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Danish at Copenhagen the 15th day of October, 1935.

When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.
- 2. A candidate for the post of Naturalist must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.
- 3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's

Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.
