TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th August, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 22nd August, 1938, to Saturday, the 27th August, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

LONDON HACKNEY CARRIAGE ACT, 1850

CAB STANDINGS.

Regulations for enforcing Order at Cab Standings in the Metropolitan Police District.

By virtue of the provisions of Section 4 of the London Hackney Carriages Act, 1850, I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby make the following Regulations to be observed by drivers of cabs at all cab standings within the Metropolitan Police District.—

(1) The drivers of the first two cabs on the standing or on any separate portion of the standing shall at all times be with their cabs and shall be available for hiring immediately they are required.

(2) No driver shall allow his cab to remain on a standing or any portion of a standing unless he is willing to accept any lawful hiring that may be offered

(3)—(1) All drivers must move their cabs up as vacancies occur, and vacancies must not be filled in any other manner.

(11) When a standing is divided into several portions, the driver of the leading cab on each portion shall move his cab up to fill any vacancy in the next portion (or in such other portion as may be set out in the Regulations appointing the standing) immediately such vacancy occurs

(4) No disabled cab shall remain on a standing longer than is reasonably necessary to effect its removal, unless such disablement is temporary and is remedied without delay

(5) Drivers must not congregate unnecessarily on, or obstruct, the carriageway or footway, and their behaviour must be such that no annoyance or disturbance is caused or is likely to be caused to residents or other persons in the vicinity.

(6) The provisions of these regulations are in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any regulations applying to particular standings

The Regulations made by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis on the 17th May, 1910, are hereby revoked.

N B—*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these Regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies*

1 Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Board at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the

Board When any vacancy which is not to be filled by promotion within the existing staff occurs the Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the Press, and the last day fixed for the receipt of applications will be stated in such advertisement.

2 Candidates must be not more than 35 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. If that date were the thirty-fifth anniversary of a candidate's birth he would be beyond the age limit

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4 Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners

5 Candidates for the post of—

(a) Second Officer must hold at least the Board of Trade Certificate as Master (Home Trade), and preference will be given to those holding certificates as Foreign or Extra Master.

(b) Second Engineer must hold at least the Board of Trade Certificate as First Class Engineer, and preference will be given to those holding the Extra First Class Certificate or whose Certificates are endorsed as valid for service on both steamships and motor ships.

(c) Motor Mechanic must have a good knowledge of marine motor engines

6. The applications of those candidates who, in the opinion of the Board, satisfy the conditions of these Regulations and are otherwise

suitable will be considered by a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Board and of the Civil Service Commission respectively. Any travelling or other expenses incurred in attending before the Selection Board will require to be defrayed by the candidate.

7 The Selection Board, who will have before them the candidate's record of service and experience, will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

8 Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard as superfluous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidates' previous work.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and in such other directions as the Commissioners think fit, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937

The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container, as the case may be.
