LONDON HACKNEY CARRIAGE ACT, 1850

CAB STANDINGS.

Regulations for enforcing Order at Cab Standings in the Metropolitan Police District.

By virtue of the provisions of Section 4 of the London Hackney Carriages Act, 1850, I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby make the following Regulations to be observed by drivers of cabs at all cab standings within the Metropolitan Police District.—

(1) The drivers of the first two cabs on the standing or on any separate portion of the standing shall at all times be with their cabs and shall be available for hiring immediately they are required.

(2) No driver shall allow his cab to remain on a standing or any portion of a standing unless he is willing to accept any lawful hiring that may be offered

(3)—(1) All drivers must move their cabs up as vacancies occur, and vacancies must not be filled in any other manner.

(11) When a standing is divided into several portions, the driver of the leading cab on each portion shall move his cab up to fill any vacancy in the next portion (or in such other portion as may be set out in the Regulations appointing the standing) immediately such vacancy occurs

(4) No disabled cab shall remain on a standing longer than is reasonably necessary to effect its removal, unless such disablement is temporary and is remedied without delay

(5) Drivers must not congregate unnecessarily on, or obstruct, the carriageway or footway, and their behaviour must be such that no annoyance or disturbance is caused or is likely to be caused to residents or other persons in the vicinity.

(6) The provisions of these regulations are in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any regulations applying to particular standings

The Regulations made by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis on the 17th May, 1910, are hereby revoked.
