### COAL MINES.

THE COAL MINES (COMMITTEES OF INVESTIGATION) RULES, 1938, DATED AUGUST 8, 1938, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930 (20 & 21 GEO. 5. C. 34) AS AMENDED BY THE COAL ACT, 1938 (1 & 2 GEO. 6. C. 52).

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sub-section (3c) of Section 5 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930 (as amended by the Coal Act, 1938) hereby make the following Rules:—

#### *Short Title and Commencement.*

1. These Rules may be cited as the Coal Mines (Committees of Investigation) Rules, 1938.

#### *Interpretation.*

2.—(i) In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Act” means the Coal Mines Act, 1930 (as amended by the Coal Act, 1938);

“The Board” means the Board of Trade;

“The Committee” means the National Committee of Investigation, or the Committee of Investigation for any district, or in relation to a complaint with respect to the operation of any district scheme the Committee of Investigation charged with the duty of investigating that complaint, as the case may be;

“The Scheme” means the Central Scheme or the District Scheme (as the case may require) for the time being in force under Part I of the Act, in relation to which the Committee is constituted.

(ii) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52-3 V. c. 63) applies to the interpretation of these Rules as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

#### *Meetings.*

3. The Committee shall hold such ordinary or special meetings as may be necessary for the transaction of business, and shall hold their ordinary meetings on such days and at such hours as they may determine.

#### *Special Meetings.*

4. A special meeting of the Committee shall be held whenever any member of the Committee shall by notice in writing to the Secretary thereof so require. The time appointed for the special meeting shall be not less than three clear days later than the date of such notice and such notice shall include particulars of the business for which the special meeting is required.

#### *Notice of Meetings.*

5. Not less than three clear days before any ordinary meeting of the Committee, and as early as possible before any special meeting

thereof, the Secretary shall send to each member of the Committee a notice in writing specifying the time and place of the meeting and the items of business to be considered.

#### *Quorum.*

6.—(i) Six members in the case of the National Committee of Investigation and four members in the case of a Committee of Investigation for any district shall respectively form a quorum.

(ii) If within half-an-hour from the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting shall be adjourned until such time as the Chairman may appoint, not being less than three nor more than seven days after the time originally appointed for such meeting, and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half-an-hour from the time appointed for the meeting the members present shall be a quorum.

#### *Voting.*

7. Every question at any meeting of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting on the question, and in the case of an equal division of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. Voting shall be by a show of hands.

#### *Minutes.*

8.—(i) The Committee shall cause minutes of their proceedings to be kept in a Minute Book, and such minutes shall be signed by the Chairman at the Meeting at which they are approved as correct. The Committee shall also cause a record to be kept showing the names of the members present at each meeting. The Minute Book and record of attendance shall be open to inspection when required by any officer of the Board.

(ii) Unless and until the contrary is proved, every meeting of the Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been made in accordance with the provisions of these Rules shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

#### *Investigation of Complaints.*

9.—(i) The Committee shall require every complaint made to them with regard to the operation of the Scheme to be stated by the complainant in writing.

(ii) Upon receipt of any complaint (not being a complaint which the Committee is precluded under the Act from investigating) the Committee shall as soon as possible inform the persons concerned of the returns accounts or other information, with which they require to be furnished and of the manner in which such information should be given, and shall hold such meeting or meetings and do all such other things as may be necessary for the purpose of investigating the complaint, and shall make without delay any report or representations in relation thereto which it may be the duty of the Committee to make under the provisions of the Act.

(iii) The Committee may hear such persons with regard to a complaint as they think fit.

*Expenses of Committee.*

10. No expenses shall be incurred by the Committee without the prior sanction of the Board, and the Secretary thereof shall keep accounts of any expenses properly incurred by or on behalf of the Committee in such form as the Board may from time to time direct.

*Forms and Notices.*

11. The forms and notices used by or on behalf of the Committee in respect of their functions shall be such as the Board may from time to time direct.

*Returns and Information to the Board.*

12. The Committee shall furnish to the Board such returns and information relating to the exercise and performance of the functions of the Committee, and to the complaints made to them with respect to the operation of the Scheme, as the Board may from time to time require.

*Declaration of Secrecy.*

13. Every member of the Committee and every officer of the Committee shall immediately on his appointment make and send to the Board a declaration of secrecy in such form as may be prescribed by the Board, and no person shall exercise or perform any functions as a member or officer of the Committee unless and until he shall have made such a declaration and sent the same to the Board.

## POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

## BERKS, BUCKS AND OXON JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

94.977

(12th August, 1938.)

Whereas by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930, as amended by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1937, and the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1938, the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the administrative counties of Berks, Buckingham and Oxford and the county boroughs of Oxford and Reading for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a Joint Committee named the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should be amended as hereinafter provided:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1938, shall come into operation on the first day of September, 1938, and shall continue in operation until the 31st day of March, 1946.

*Interpretation.*

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

“ the combined areas ” means the counties and county boroughs for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

“ the Joint Committee ” means the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee constituted under the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930;

“ council ” means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and “ councils ” means the councils of all the counties and county boroughs so included;

“ casual ” means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

“ casual ward ” means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

“ the Minister ” means the Minister of Health.

*Revocation of Previous Orders.*

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order the recited Orders are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything done, or to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred, under those Orders.

*Combination of Counties and County Boroughs.*

4. The counties of Berks, Buckingham and Oxford and the county boroughs of Oxford and Reading shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

*Joint Committee.*

5.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the Joint Committee shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal and power to hold land for the purposes of their functions without licence in mortmain.

(2) The Joint Committee shall consist of 30 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected.

(3) Seven members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by the council of the county of Berks, eight members by the council of the county of Buckingham and five members shall be elected by each of the councils of the county of Oxford and the county boroughs of Oxford and Reading.

*Members of Joint Committee.*

6.—(1) The persons who are members of the Joint Committee immediately before the commencement of this Order shall continue in office.

(2) In each year at the first meeting of each council held after the last day of February at which ordinary business is transacted, the council shall elect from their own body the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this Order.

(3) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office upon his election.

(4) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(5) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

*Period of Office.*

7.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.

(2) a member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and

the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee arising more than one month before the ordinary date for the election of a new committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

#### *Meetings and Proceedings.*

8. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

#### *Powers and Duties of Joint Committee.*

9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuats for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall in respect of each financial year subsequent to the thirty-first day of March, 1938, repay to each of the councils—

(a) the expenses incurred by the council during that year, with the approval of the Joint Committee, in the provision of accommodation for casuats in accordance with any requirement of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites); and

(b) any expenditure reasonably incurred by the council during that year in—

(i) the maintenance of casual wards;

(ii) the reception and relief of casuats;

(iii) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;

(iv) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;

(v) the burial of any casual;

(vi) the maintenance, care and education of any casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;

(vii) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;

(viii) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuats.

(4) In the event of any premises referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (3) of this Article being closed, whether temporarily or permanently, following upon a recommendation in that behalf made to the Minister by the

Joint Committee the liability of the Joint Committee under that sub-paragraph shall not be thereby affected and the Joint Committee shall, in each financial year in which the premises are closed, pay to the council by whom the premises were provided any expenditure incurred by that council with the approval of the Joint Committee in respect of—

(a) the maintenance of the said premises, and

(b) any compensation or superannuation contributions or allowances payable to any officer or servant in consequence of the closure of the said premises;

(5) Upon any sale, letting or other disposition or upon any appropriation for a purpose other than the accommodation of casuats of any premises referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (3) of this Article or any part thereof there shall be an adjustment in accordance with the provisions of section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, of the financial relations subsisting by virtue of the said sub-paragraph between the Council by whom the premises were provided and the Joint Committee.

(6) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely—

(i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

(v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuats;

(vi) treatment of female and child casuats;

(vii) dietary;

(viii) discharge and detention; and

(ix) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(7) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuats:

(8) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuats, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.

#### *Expenses of Members.*

10.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray expenditure, including travelling expenses, necessarily incurred by members of the Joint



Committee or any sub-committee thereof for the purpose of attending meetings of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof:

Provided that payment in respect of expenditure other than travelling expenses shall only be made to a member of the Joint Committee in respect of meetings held outside the geographical county of the constituent authority he represents and shall be limited in the case of each member, to an amount not exceeding five shillings a day.

(2) The Joint Committee may confer with other Joint Committees for all or any of the purposes of this Order, and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and may also defray any expenses necessarily incurred by their representatives in travelling to and from such conferences.

#### *Contracts.*

11. All contracts and agreements relating to the purposes of this Order shall be made by the Joint Committee, and shall be signed and sealed on their behalf by the presiding chairman and by one other member of the Joint Committee, and countersigned by the clerk to the Joint Committee.

#### *Expenses of Joint Committee.*

12. A fund shall be established to be called the Joint Fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried, and out of which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

#### *Estimates, Accounts and Payments.*

13.—(1) The accounting period shall be from the 1st day of April in any year to the 31st day of March in the following year.

(2) The Joint Committee shall, not later than the 10th day of January before the commencement of each accounting period, transmit to each of the councils an estimate of the expenditure of the Joint Committee during that period together with an estimate of the amount which will be payable by each of the councils in respect of that period, and shall from time to time transmit to each of the councils such revised or other estimates as may become necessary.

#### *Apportionment of Expenses.*

14. For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee for the purposes of this order, each of the councils shall contribute to the Joint Fund in the proportion which the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in their area as shown in the valuation lists on the 1st day of April immediately preceding the date of the order made on the council by the Joint Committee for contributions in respect of those expenses bears to the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in the combined area as then shown in the valuation lists.

#### *Contribution Orders.*

15.—(1) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as may be after the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year, make orders on each of the councils for the payment to the Joint Committee of such sums as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee.

(2) Every order for contributions shall direct that the contribution shall be paid in one sum or by instalments, as the Joint Committee may see fit, on the dates mentioned in the order.

(3) Any sum mentioned in any order for contributions shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed, and may be recovered accordingly: Provided that the Joint Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until after the expiration of a period of three months from the date of the order.

#### *Application of Statutes and Orders.*

16.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this Order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.

(2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their sub-committees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable.

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this Order.

#### *Reports.*

17. As soon as may be after the thirty-first day of March in each year, the Joint Committee shall furnish to the councils a report on their proceedings for the twelve months ending on that day and such other reports, returns and information as any council may from time to time reasonably require.

#### *Settlement of Disputes.*

18. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event, the provisions of the Arbitration Act,

1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

#### *Financial Adjustments.*

19. Upon the expiration or sooner revocation of this Order, or upon any alteration of this Order by the Minister, the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses (so far as affected by the expiration, revocation or alteration of this Order) of, and any financial relations between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

### SCHEDULE.

#### *Rules as to Meetings and Proceedings.*

1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings for the transaction of general business which as near as may be shall be held at regular intervals.

(2) The first meeting held after the 31st day of March in any year shall be the annual meeting.

2. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.

3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least five members are present thereat.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.

(2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend the meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.
