REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE BANKRUPTCY AND COMPANIES EX-HEADQUARTERS SERVICE OF THE BOARD OF TRADE.

2.
