The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933 (23 & 24 Geo. 5. c. 12) (hereinafter called "the Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places (which, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2 & 3 Vict., c. 71, and 3 & 4 Vict., c. 84), may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order:

And whereas by the Act it is further enacted that any such Order in Council may be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order:

And whereas in pursuance of the Act His Majesty in Council was pleased to make an Order on the twenty-third day of June, 1938, entitled the Juvenile Courts (Metropolitan Police Court Area) Order, 1938 (S.R. & O. 1938 (No. 614)):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In the first column of the Schedule to the Juvenile Courts (Metropolitan Police Court Area) Order, 1938 (S.R. & O. 1938 (No. 614)), there shall be substituted for the words "Springfield Hall, 200, Wandsworth Road,

S.W.8" the words "Lambeth Town Hall, Brixton Hill, S.W.2."

2. This Order may be cited as the Juvenile Courts (Metropolitan Police Court Area) (Amendment) Order, 1938, and shall come into force on the second day of September, 1938.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS AS OFFICER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE (MALE) UNDER THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age are 19 and 21. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of any year the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March in that year; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 19 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 21 on that date would not be admitted. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made:—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served.

(ii) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates must be unmarried and without family and must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the examination and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
