Order No. 5752.

Authorises a special sale of Pedigree Breeding Pigs in Yeovil Market by R. B. Taylor & Sons on the 16th September, 1938, subject to the conditions prescribed in the Order.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 95.)

SUBJECT.

I. Declares the Area described in the Schedule to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

II. Provides that paragraph (1) of Article 8 (Straying of Animals) of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 shall not apply in relation to any road or highway in that part of the Forest of Dean which is included in the Infected Area described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

IN THE COUNTY OF HEREFORD.

The city of Hereford.

The petty sessional divisions of Ledbury, Hereford, Ross and Harewood End.

*In the petty sessional division of
Leominster.*

The parishes of Stoke Prior (*except its detached part*) Ford, Newton, Humber, Hope under Dinmore, Bodenham and the detached part of the parish of Docklow.

*In the petty sessional division of
Bromyard.*

The parishes of Cradley, Evesbatch, Bishop's Frome, Acton Beauchamp, Stanford Bishop, Linton, Bromyard, Avenbury, Winslow, Stoke Lacy, Pencombe with Grendon Warren, Grendon Bishop, Bredenbury, Little Cowarne, Ullingswick, Moreton Jeffreys, Much Cowarne, Ocle Pychard and Felton.

*In the petty sessional division of
Weobley.*

The parishes of Canon Pyon, Wormsley, Brinsop, Mansell Lacy, Mansell Gamage, Bishopstone, Byford, Bridge Sollers and Preston on Wye.

*In the petty sessional division of
Dore.*

The parishes of Tyberton, Madley, Kingstone, Abbey Dore, Bacton, Thruxton, Treville, St. Devereux, Wormbridge, Kilpeck, Kentchurch, Kenderchurch, Ewyas Harold, Dulas,

Rowlstone, and so much of the parish of Vowchurch as lies to the east of the road running from Stockley Hill via Hill Farm, Vowchurch Common, The Croft and Eaton Hill to Bacon Station.

IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH.

The borough of Monmouth.

*In the petty sessional division of
Skenfrith.*

The parish of Llangattock-Vibon-Avel United and so much of the parish of Grosmont Fawr as lies to the east and north-east of the road running from Pontrilas via Monmouth Cap, The Hand, Bower, Greig Lodge and Grosmontwood Farm to Cross Ash.

IN THE COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER.

The petty sessional division of Newent.

*In the petty sessional division of
Coleford.*

The parishes of English Bicknor, Staunton, Coleford, West Dean, Lydbrook and so much of the parishes of East Dean and Ruardean as lies within the petty sessional division of Coleford.

*In the petty sessional division of
Newnham.*

The parishes of Longhope, Mitcheldean, Blaisdon and Little Dean; so much of the parishes of East Dean and Ruardean as lies within the petty sessional division of Newnham; and so much of the parishes of Newnham and Westbury-on-Severn as lies to the west and north-west of the following boundary, namely, the road running from Blakeney via Newnham Church, Broad Oak and Elton Court to the point about half a mile north-east of Elton Court where the Great Western Railway Line running from Newnham to Gloucester crosses the said road, thence following the said Railway line to Gloucester.

*In the petty sessional division of
Gloucester.*

The parishes of Hasfield, Ashleworth and Hartpury; so much of the parish of Churcham as lies to the north of the Great Western Railway running from Newnham to Gloucester; and so much of the parishes of Highnam and Maisemore as lies to the north and west of the following boundary, namely, the road running from Huntley via Linton to Alney Island Bridge, thence following the River Severn to Tewkesbury.

*In the petty sessional division of
Tewkesbury.*

The parish of Tirley.

IN THE COUNTY OF WORCESTER.

*In the petty sessional division of
Upton on Severn.*

The parishes of Pendock including its detached part, Eldersfield, Longdon, Berrow, Birtsmorton, Castlemorton and Welland; and so much of the parishes of Hanley Castle and Upton upon Severn as lies to the west of the road running from Longdon via Upton upon Severn Church, Pool House, Hanley Castle, North End Farm and Cliffe Wood to Portocks End.
