FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 10th October, 1938, he made Regulations under subsection (9) of Section 73 of the Factories Act, 1937, enabling the occupier of a factory in which is carried on the manufacture of a variety of light metal articles or of fittings or accessories composed wholly or largely of metal to adopt the provisions of the Regulations allowing overtime employment to be calculated by reference to the individual, in substitution for the provisions of the Section limiting overtime employment by reference to the factory.
