A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 27, 1938,
A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN
ENGLAND AND WALES AND IN NORTHERN
IRELAND.

GEORGE, R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, and The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th November, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th November, 1938, to Saturday, the 19th November, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the

following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

BOROUGH OF ASHTON-UNDER-LYNE.

BYELAWS WITH RESPECT TO TROLLEY VEHICLES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Ashton-under-Lyne in the County of Lancaster, empowered by the provisions of Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as applied by Section 14 of the Ashton-under-Lyne Corporation Act, 1924, to make byelaws with respect to the trolley vehicles of the Corporation, under and by virtue and in pursuance of the powers for that purpose given by the said Acts in Council assembled on the twenty-sixth day of October, 1938, did duly make and adopt the following Byelaws:—

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Byelaws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Ashton-under-Lyne; the words "Trolley vehicle undertaking" mean the Trolley vehicle system worked by the Corporation, situate within or outside the Borough of Ashton-under-Lyne; the words "Trolley Vehicle" mean a mechanically propelled vehicle adapted for use upon roads without rails and moved by electrical power transmitted thereto from some external source; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a trolley vehicle; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a trolley vehicle; "Interior of a trolley vehicle" shall not include the upper deck of double-decked trolley vehicles.

Entering and Leaving Trolley Vehicles.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a trolley vehicle by the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise,

Every person desiring to enter a trolley vehicle for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons intending to alight from the trolley vehicle to do so.

Entering or Leaving Trolley Vehicle in Motion.

3. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any trolley vehicle whilst in motion.

Smoking.

4. No passenger shall smoke in the interior of any trolley vehicle. Provided that this byelaw shall not apply to any part of a single-deck trolley vehicle where it shall be indicated by notice fixed on the inside of the trolley vehicle that smoking is allowed.

Offensive Language and Conduct.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any trolley vehicle, or spit or commit any nuisance in, upon, from or against any trolley vehicle, trolley vehicle station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the trolley vehicle undertaking or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No person shall, while travelling in or upon any trolley vehicle, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg, or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble or throw down and leave in or upon any trolley vehicle, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit, or any other objectionable matter in or upon any trolley vehicle, trolley vehicle station, waiting room or premises as aforesaid.

Objectionable Persons.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor is unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or mount upon any trolley vehicle, and any such person may be prevented from mounting or entering any trolley vehicle, and any such person found in or upon any trolley vehicle shall leave the trolley vehicle on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the trolley vehicle by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Trolley Vehicle.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number-plate, printed or other notice, in or on the trolley vehicle, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any trolley vehicle. Any person acting in contravention of this byelaw shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these byelaws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a trolley vehicle, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the trolley vehicle or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person, who in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be

entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any trolley vehicle, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any trolley vehicle, and shall not enter the interior of any trolley vehicle after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if found in the interior of any trolley vehicle, shall on request of the Conductor, leave the interior of the trolley vehicle upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Provided that on double-decked trolley vehicles any such person shall, if directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Payment of Fares.

9. Every passenger on a trolley vehicle shall unless he is the holder of a ticket in respect of that journey immediately upon demand before leaving the trolley vehicle declare the journey he intends to take or has taken and pay the Conductor the fare for the whole of such journey and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid.

Except as provided by byelaw 18 hereof, such ticket shall only be available by the trolley vehicle on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued, and any person leaving the trolley vehicle shall be deemed to have completed his journey. A person travelling beyond the stage or journey for which his ticket is available shall immediately upon demand before leaving the trolley vehicle pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the stage or journey to which he had paid the fare.

Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the Conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers,

Luggage.

12. A passenger shall not bring or attempt to bring on to any trolley vehicle any luggage or parcel exceeding 56 pounds in weight and a passenger shall not if so directed by the Conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation bring or attempt to bring on to any trolley vehicle any luggage other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 pounds in weight or any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the trolley vehicle.

A passenger shall in respect of all luggage (other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 pounds in weight) taken or brought by him upon any trolley vehicle pay to the

Conductor for the carriage of the same, the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of parcels or luggage upon a trolley vehicle and displayed in the trolley vehicle.

Travelling on Steps.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any trolley vehicle or stand on the upper deck or sit on the roof of the trolley vehicle, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any trolley vehicle. No person shall improperly hold or hang on by or to any part of any trolley vehicle, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the trolley vehicle with the consent of the Conductor.

Full number of Passengers.

14. When any trolley vehicle contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional persons shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such trolley vehicle when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

Dogs.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on the lower deck of any double-decked trolley vehicle, and no dog or other animal shall be allowed upon the upper deck of any double-decked trolley vehicle or upon a single-decked trolley vehicle except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal allowed on any trolley vehicle shall be carried or held on a leash. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any trolley vehicle after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any trolley vehicle in breach of this byelaw shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the trolley vehicle immediately on request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

A passenger shall in respect of a dog taken or brought by him upon any trolley vehicle pay to the Conductor for the carriage of such dog the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of dogs upon a trolley vehicle and displayed in the trolley vehicle.

Firearms, etc.

16. A person shall not enter, mount upon or remain in any trolley vehicle with a loaded firearm, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which might be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance, or to soil, injure or damage any trolley vehicle or the clothing of any passenger.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

17. No person other than the Conductor or Driver or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, switches, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a trolley vehicle or its equipment, and, except in a case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation shall signal a trolley vehicle to start or stop.

No passenger shall, when a trolley vehicle is in motion, speak to the Driver or distract his attention except in cases of emergency.

Disabled Trolley Vehicles.

18. If at any time a trolley vehicle becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available trolley vehicle the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the permission of the Conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged trolley vehicle.

Obstructions.

19. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any trolley vehicle or the trolley vehicle system of the Corporation.

Power to remove Passengers committing Offences.

20. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any trolley vehicle, any breach of these byelaws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be removed immediately from the trolley vehicle by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

21. The Conductor and Driver of each trolley vehicle shall enforce or prevent the breach of these byelaws to the best of their ability.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these byelaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each trolley vehicle in use a printed copy of these byelaws.

24. These byelaws shall come into force on the first day of January, 1939.
