

entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any trolley vehicle, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any trolley vehicle, and shall not enter the interior of any trolley vehicle after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if found in the interior of any trolley vehicle, shall on request of the Conductor, leave the interior of the trolley vehicle upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Provided that on double-decked trolley vehicles any such person shall, if directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Payment of Fares.

9. Every passenger on a trolley vehicle shall unless he is the holder of a ticket in respect of that journey immediately upon demand before leaving the trolley vehicle declare the journey he intends to take or has taken and pay the Conductor the fare for the whole of such journey and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid.

Except as provided by byelaw 18 hereof, such ticket shall only be available by the trolley vehicle on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued, and any person leaving the trolley vehicle shall be deemed to have completed his journey. A person travelling beyond the stage or journey for which his ticket is available shall immediately upon demand before leaving the trolley vehicle pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the stage or journey to which he had paid the fare.

Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the Conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers,

Luggage.

12. A passenger shall not bring or attempt to bring on to any trolley vehicle any luggage or parcel exceeding 56 pounds in weight and a passenger shall not if so directed by the Conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation bring or attempt to bring on to any trolley vehicle any luggage other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 pounds in weight or any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the trolley vehicle.

A passenger shall in respect of all luggage (other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 pounds in weight) taken or brought by him upon any trolley vehicle pay to the

Conductor for the carriage of the same, the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of parcels or luggage upon a trolley vehicle and displayed in the trolley vehicle.

Travelling on Steps.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any trolley vehicle or stand on the upper deck or sit on the roof of the trolley vehicle, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any trolley vehicle. No person shall improperly hold or hang on by or to any part of any trolley vehicle, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the trolley vehicle with the consent of the Conductor.

Full number of Passengers.

14. When any trolley vehicle contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional persons shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such trolley vehicle when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

Dogs.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on the lower deck of any double-decked trolley vehicle, and no dog or other animal shall be allowed upon the upper deck of any double-decked trolley vehicle or upon a single-decked trolley vehicle except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal allowed on any trolley vehicle shall be carried or held on a leash. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any trolley vehicle after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any trolley vehicle in breach of this byelaw shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the trolley vehicle immediately on request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

A passenger shall in respect of a dog taken or brought by him upon any trolley vehicle pay to the Conductor for the carriage of such dog the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of dogs upon a trolley vehicle and displayed in the trolley vehicle.

Firearms, etc.

16. A person shall not enter, mount upon or remain in any trolley vehicle with a loaded firearm, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which might be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance, or to soil, injure or damage any trolley vehicle or the clothing of any passenger.
