PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of September, 1938, (C.W. 10948/38) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 24th day of February, 1938, Your Majesty was pleased to approve the institution of a special category of Officers to be employed on air duties in Your Majesty's Fleet:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the requirements of the Air Arm of Your Majesty's Fleet necessitate provision for the employment of such Officers on observing duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the allowances set forth in the enclosed Schedule accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"I. The provision for flying pay in Schedule 2 (B) of Order in Council dated the 24th day of February, 1938, is cancelled.

"II. Air Officers of the Royal Navy employed on, or undergoing instruction in, the piloting of aircraft, and holding appointments involving a continuous and definite liability to make ascents in aircraft, to be paid allowances as follows: the allowances to be paid continuously while serving in such appointments:—

Midshipmen (A) ...	4s. a day.
Acting Sub-Lieutenants (A) ...	} 6s. a day.
Sub-Lieutenants (A) ...	
Lieutenants (A) ...	
Lieutenant Commanders (A) ...	

"III.—(a) Air Officers of the Royal Navy (with the exception of Midshipmen (A)) employed on observing duties to be eligible for rates of observers allowance laid down for executive officers of the Royal Navy employed on such duties.

"(b) Midshipmen (A) whilst undergoing courses of instruction for observer duties to be eligible for an allowance of 3s. for each day on which they make an ascent in aircraft.

"(c) Midshipmen (A), after qualifying as observer, to be eligible for an allowance of 4s. a day, to be paid continuously whilst they hold appointments for observers duties."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of August, 1938 (C.W. 4581/38) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 24th day of February 1938 Your Majesty was pleased to approve the institution of a special category of officers to be employed on air duties in Your Majesty's Fleet:

"And whereas we are of opinion that officers of the Royal Navy, both of the Air and Engineer Categories, who qualify in aeronautical engineering should be eligible for certain special rates of pay and allowances:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the pay and allowances set down in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" SCHEDULE.

1. Air Officers of the Royal Navy whilst undergoing courses of instruction in aeronautical engineering to be eligible for an allowance of 6s. a day.

2. Air Officers of the Royal Navy who qualify in aeronautical engineering to be eligible for full pay, half pay and unemployed pay on the scale laid down for Engineer Officers of the Royal Navy of corresponding rank and seniority.

3. Officers of the Royal Navy of the relative rank of Lieutenant, Lieutenant-Commander or Commander who are qualified in aeronautical engineering to receive an allowance of 3s. 6d. a day whilst holding appointments for such duties."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas for service as Rating Pilot men are required to belong to the Seaman branch of Your Majesty's Navy, being transferred thereto if belonging to another branch of the Naval service when selected for training:

"And whereas men who are so transferred will, in certain circumstances, be debarré under the existing regulations from counting their time in the Seaman branch for pay purposes if they revert to their former branch:

"And whereas in order to remove such disadvantage we are of opinion that the time served in the Seaman branch should at our discretion be reckoned as if it had been served in the branch from which the man was transferred for training as Rating Pilot, if he reverts to his former branch:

"We beg leave most humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to give Your sanction accordingly:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposal."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of September, 1938 (N. 4755/38), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 6th February, 1922, the 12th February, 1923, and the 15th May, 1930, sanction was given, inter alia, to certain scales of pensions to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men who, consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability, are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service before completing time for Long Service Pension:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the scales of pensions allowable under Orders in Council of the 6th February, 1922, the 12th February, 1923, and the 15th May, 1930, should be revised in certain respects in the case of men who are invalided towards the end of their normal engagements:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise us to award to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men who consequent on wounds, hurts, or disability are invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Service on or after the 20th August, 1938, pensions at the revised rates shown in the annexed Schedule, but otherwise subject to the restrictions, conditions and provisions at present in force.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, as amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936 (which latter Act is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1936") it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any of the provisions of this Act other than this section shall extend, with such exceptions, adaptations and modifications, if any, as may be specified in the Order, to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands, any colony, any British protectorate or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by subsection 1 of section 35 of the Act of 1936 it is provided that that Act shall be construed as one with the Air Navigation Act, 1920, which as amended by the Act of 1936 is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act":

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the principal Act, and the provisions of the Act of 1936 shall extend to the Isle of Man with the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas by subsection 2 of section 30 of the Act of 1936 it is enacted that an Order in Council made under any of the provisions of the principal Act and that Act may contain such incidental and supplementary provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary or expedient for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act of 1936, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the principal Act other than section 4, and of the Act of 1936, shall extend to the Isle of Man with the exceptions, adaptations and modifications specified in the Schedule hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation Acts (Extension to the Isle of Man) Order, 1938.

PART II.

A.—General Adaptations and Modifications.

Save as herein otherwise expressly provided the following expressions in the principal Act and in the Act of 1936 shall have the meanings hereinafter provided:—

“The United Kingdom” shall be construed as including the Isle of Man.

“The High Court” shall mean the High Court of Justice of the Isle of Man.

“Workmen’s Compensation Acts” shall mean the Workmen’s Compensation Acts of the Isle of Man.

PART II.

B.—Adaptations and modifications of the principal Act.

In subsection three of section seven for the reference to the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act 1919 there shall be substituted a reference to the Public Authorities (Acquisition of Land) Acts of the Isle of Man.

For the purposes of section eight “The Government Property Trustees” shall be deemed to be a local authority to which the section applies; provided that the Government Property Trustees shall not, in exercise of the powers conferred by that section, acquire land without the approval of Tynwald.

For subsection four of section eight the following subsection shall be substituted:—

4. The Government Property Trustees may borrow for the purposes of this section on a

resolution of Tynwald approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty’s Treasury.

For subsection two of section fourteen the following subsection shall be substituted:—

“(2) Proceedings in the Isle of Man for any offence under this Act or under an Order in Council or regulations made thereunder shall be taken at the suit of the Attorney General of the Isle of Man.”

PART II.

C.—Adaptations and Modifications of the Act of 1936.

At the end of subsection three of section three the following proviso shall be added:—

“Provided also that byelaws shall not be made in pursuance of this subsection except after consultation with the Secretary of State.”

In subsections one to seven of section fourteen, for the words “Secretary of State” there shall be substituted the words “Lieutenant Governor of the Isle of Man”; and for the words “Lord Chief Justice” there shall be substituted the words “First Deemster and Clerk of the Rolls”.

At the end of subsection one of section twenty-six the following paragraph shall be added:—

“Where an Order in Council under this subsection has been made His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the enactments thereby applied other than Part II of the Military Lands Act, 1892, with any necessary modifications and adaptations shall extend to the Isle of Man”.

In subsection five of section twenty-six for the words “Northern Ireland” there shall be substituted the words “the Isle of Man” in both places where those words occur.

In subparagraph 2 (a) (ii) of paragraph one of the Third Schedule for the words “United Kingdom” there shall be substituted the words “Isle of Man”.

In Part I of the Fourth Schedule the words “Part II of the Military Lands Act, 1892” shall be omitted.

The KING’s Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Tatham and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tatham Fells, both of which Benefices are situated in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Tatham and Tatham Fells duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Blackburn and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Blackburn signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Blackburn embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Tatham is now full the Reverend Arthur Senior Roberts being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Tatham Fells is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Tatham Fells in favour of the Reverend John Cort Livesey, formerly Incumbent of that Benefice:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Tatham Fells now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Tatham:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and of the said Arthur Senior Roberts (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Tatham and the said Benefice of Tatham Fells shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Tatham and Tatham Fells' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur Senior Roberts if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tatham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tatham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tatham Fells and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for a nominal sum to the intent that such house and grounds shall be secured for the purposes of a Church House for the United Benefice.

"4. That (a) upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowment of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice that is to say a part sufficient to produce £100 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said

Benefice of Tatham pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Tatham and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as to one moiety for the augmentation of the Benefice of Leck and as to the other moiety for the augmentation of the Benefice of Silverdale both in the said Diocese of Blackburn, and (b) upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the pension now payable to the said John Cort Livesey as aforesaid, whichever shall the later happen, a further part sufficient to produce £100 per annum of the said sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated under the hereinbefore mentioned provisions of the said Tithe Act, 1936, shall also be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Tatham and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as to one quarter for the augmentation of the Benefice of Carnforth, Christ Church, and as to three quarters for the augmentation of the Benefice of Bolton le Sands both also in the said Diocese of Blackburn.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Tatham.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Blackburn has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of July, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Acrise, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Acrise is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Arthur Norman Watney, of Acryse Place, Folkestone, in the said County of Kent, Esquire:

"And whereas the said Arthur Norman Watney is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Acrise now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has

that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Acrise which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Acrise:

of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the Benefice of Worcester, Saint Peter in the said County and Diocese of Worcester and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Worcester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Andrew and All Saints, is now full the Reverend William Robert Buchanan-Dunlop being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Helen with Saint Alban and Saint Michael in Bedwardine is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Helen with Saint Alban and Saint Michael in Bedwardine is exercisable wholly by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Worcester, and the patronage of the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Andrew and All Saints is exercisable alternately by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Worcester and by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin at Worcester:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Arthur, Bishop of Worcester and the said William Robert Buchanan-Dunlop (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Helen with Saint Alban and Saint Michael in Bedwardine and the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Andrew and All Saints, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Worcester Saint Andrew and All Saints with Saint Helen' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of All Saints, Worcester, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the Parish of All Saints, Worcester, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Robert Buchanan-Dunlop if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Andrew and All Saints, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at any of the Churches within the United Parish other than the Parish Church shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

"5. That (a) upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Helen

with Saint Alban and Saint Michael in Bedwardine shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and (b) such a sum not exceeding £250 as shall be determined by the Bishop of Worcester, being part of a capital sum of £1,608 11s. 11d. now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Worcester, Saint Andrew and All Saints and arising in respect of the sale of the Parsonage House formerly belonging to that Benefice, shall be applied towards the cost of such repairs and improvements to the Parsonage House so constituted the Parsonage House of the United Benefice as shall be approved by the Bishop of Worcester.

Provided always that pending the selection of such District or Districts as aforesaid, a part, that is to say £200 per annum, of the above-mentioned income amounting to £321 7s. shall, if and so long as the Bishop of Worcester shall so direct be paid by us, either to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Claines or to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Barbourne, Saint Stephen, both in the said Diocese of Worcester as the Bishop of Worcester shall determine, conditionally upon the employment by such Incumbent of a Curate to serve the locality known as Becketts Close.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stockbridge which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so

recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Stockbridge:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent as aforesaid of the said Edward Rigby Kewley and Eleanor Hilda Kewley (in testimony whereof they have severally signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stockbridge now vested in him, the said Edward Rigby Kewley, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Rigby Kewley and Eleanor Hilda Kewley to hold as joint tenants for the term of their joint lives and as from the decease of one of them shall be transferred to the survivor of them for the term of his or her natural life, and as from the decease of the survivor shall be transferred to and be vested in the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Rainham and all that part of the said Benefice of Gillingham which is described in the Second Schedule hereto annexed and is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured green shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided under the style of 'The Benefice (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice) of Rainham' and that such United Benefice shall form part of the Diocese of Rochester, of the Archdeaconry of Rochester and of the Rural Deanery of

Rochester and the said Arthur Douglas Hodgson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rainham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Rainham shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Rainham shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Rainham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That the endowments of the United Benefice shall consist of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Rainham and no part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Gillingham shall be transferred or annexed to the United Benefice by reason of the union hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

" 5. That the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Rainham.

" PART III.

" As to the union of the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, with a part of the said Benefice of Gillingham:

" 1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, and all that part of the said Benefice of Gillingham which is described in the Third Schedule hereto annexed and is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured yellow shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided under the style of ' The Benefice (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice) of Luton, Christ Church ' and the said Guy Percival Phelps if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Luton, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Luton, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That the endowments of the United Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, shall consist of the present endowments of the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church, and no part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Gillingham shall be transferred or annexed to the United Benefice by reason of the union hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

" 5. That the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Luton, Christ Church.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the

matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

in the year 1937 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence westward along such fence for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Shirecliffe Lane and extending thence first westward to and then southward along the middle of Shirecliffe Lane for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath leading to Herries Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Parkwood Springs, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Douglas Road with the roadway or footpath leading to Parkwood Road, and extending thence in a straight line due west for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the main line of the London and North Eastern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pitsmoor from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Neepsend."

By-Product Company Limited and for the purposes of any such agreement to break up Holmewood Lane (from Holmewood Farm to Out Lane) Hawking Lane (from Holmewood Lane to Stainsby) Stainsby Lane (from Stainsby to Stainsbybrook) Stainsby Lane (from Stainsbybrook to Deep Lane) Stanley Lane (from Deep Lane to the boundary of the district) all in the parish of Ault Hucknall in the rural district of Blackwell and in any streets or parts of roads so broken up to lay down and place mains pipes and other works and to extend to the powers referred to in this paragraph the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Act 1847 with respect to the breaking up of streets for the purpose of laying pipes.

PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1936.

Notice is hereby given in terms of Section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act, 1936, that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having considered a representation by the authorities of the Methodist Church that it is expedient that the undermentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which they desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would be more properly obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act:—

2. To dissolve the Trustees for Wesleyan Methodist Chapel Purposes (Registered) and the Trustees for United Methodist Church Purposes Registered and transfer to and vest in the new Board all the property rights and liabilities of the existing Trustees.

3. To empower the Board to receive and hold property upon trust connected with the Methodist Church.

4. To authorise the Annual Conference of the Methodist Church to adopt a Trust Deed declaring the trusts of the property transferred to or hereafter held by the Board and to make provision for altering such Trust Deed.

5. To transfer the orphanages of the Methodist Church situate at Alresford and Harrogate to the Trustees for the National Children's Home and Orphanage Registered to be held upon the same trusts as the property of such Trustees is held for the Methodist Church and to release and indemnify the existing Trustees of the said orphanages.

6. To change the name of the Trustees for the Wesleyan Methodist Connexional Funds (Registered) to "The Trustees for the Methodist Connexional Funds (Registered)".

7. To empower the Annual Conference of the Methodist Church to remove trustees of any property held upon trusts for the use and benefit of the Methodist Church or any society institution or charity subsidiary or ancillary to the Methodist Church and to appoint new trustees in the place of trustees so removed.
