

years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 13th day of October, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Ecclesfield and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Ecclesfield and the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Ecclesfield and of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of June, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month the Benefice of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul), the Benefice of Saint Paul, Sheffield, the Benefice of Saint James, Sheffield, and the Benefice of Saint Jude, Moorfields, all in the said County and Diocese were prospectively united into one Benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that new Districts selected by the Bishop of Sheffield should be formed in the vicinity of the City of Sheffield and that upon any of the three Benefices of Saint Paul, Sheffield, Saint James, Sheffield and Saint Jude, Moorfields, becoming united to the said Benefice of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul) the endowments of such one of the said three Benefices should be appropriated for the endowment of one of such new Districts, and that the patronage of such new Districts should belong to and be vested in the Patron of the Benefice from which the endowments have been appropriated:

“ And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of Sheffield as the District for which the endowments of the said Benefice of Saint James, Sheffield, should be appropriated when such Benefice becomes united to the said Benefice of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul) as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

“ And whereas the endowments now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in

favour of the said Benefice of Saint James, Sheffield, provide an income of £357 per annum:

“ And whereas at the date of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council the patronage of the said Benefice of Saint James, Sheffield, was vested in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the Parish of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul):

“ And whereas by a certain Deed bearing date on or about the 13th day of October, 1938, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the ‘ New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856,’ or some or one of them between the Reverend Thomas Hugh Pyke, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, of the first part, the Parochial Church Council of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, as the Patrons of the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield, of the second part, the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, the Ordinary of the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the fourth part (which Deed is intended to be registered in the books of the Charity Commissioners) the said Thomas Hugh Pyke did, with the consents of the said Parochial Church Council and of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a sum of £2,857 2s. 10d. £3 10s. per centum Conversion Stock, now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for the said Vicarage of Ecclesfield, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the secondly herein mentioned Act and of his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and of his successors:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid and to his successors, such grant to cease upon the date on which the endowment of the said Benefice of Saint James, Sheffield, becomes available towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Ecclesfield and of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Wincobank, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall,
