WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of October, 1938 (N. 6186/38) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of July, 1938, to sanction revised rates of non-substantive pay for Gunnery ratings in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines:

"And whereas we consider that an allowance of 6d. a day, to be called 'Instructional Allowance,' should be granted to Quartermaster Sergeant Instructors of Gunnery, Royal Marines, with effect from the date on which the arrangements under Order in Council of 28th July become effective:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of powers vested in Him by virtue of the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927 and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation

(Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1935, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1936, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1937, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1937, and the Air Navigation (Aden) Order, 1938, amending the first mentioned Order, which Order as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order":

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Him by the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, and the Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) Orders, 1937 and 1938, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Amendment of Article 22.

1. In Paragraph (1) of Article 22 of the principal Order the words "preceded, in the case of a signal by radio telephony, by the name of the owner of the aircraft" shall be omitted.

Civil Air Ensign.

2. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 22 of the principal Order:—

"Civil Air Ensign.

22A.—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided the Civil Air Ensign established by the Civil Air Ensign Order, 1937, shall not be flown on any aircraft or on any ship or boat or on any building or elsewhere within the Colony.

(2) The Civil Air Ensign may be flown (a) on any British aircraft, (b) at any aerodrome situated in the Colony which is licensed under this Order, (c) by the person operating an Air Transport undertaking owning British aircraft upon or in proximity to any building occupied by him as his principal office or place of business, (d) by any person to whom permission in writing is granted for the purpose by the Governor, at such places and subject to such conditions as may be specified in such permission, provided that the Civil Air Ensign shall not be hoisted on board any ship or boat belonging to any British subject or any person under His Majesty's protection without warrant from His Majesty or from the Admiralty."

Amendment of Article 27.

3. Article 27 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(1) A colon shall be substituted for the full stop at the end of paragraph (1).

(2) The following proviso shall be inserted at the end of paragraph (1):—

"Provided that, in the case of military aircraft used for the purposes of an Auxiliary Air Unit, a Civil flying school, or any other establishment in which instruction in flying is given, where such an

aircraft is not commanded by a person in naval, military or air-force service detailed for the purpose, it shall be necessary to comply with the requirements of the following provisions of this Order, that is to say:—

(i) Article 7 in so far as it relates to the provisions of Schedule IV to this Order;

(ii) Paragraphs (1) (2) and (4) of Article 10;

(iii) Article 12; and

(iv) Article 13."

Amendment of Article 30.

4. Article 30 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(1) A semi-colon shall be substituted for the full stop at the end of sub-paragraph (b).

(2) The following sub-paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (b):—

"(c) for prescribing the scales of charges at aerodromes and the fees to be paid in respect of the grant of any certificate or licence or any other matter."

Amendment of Schedule I.

5. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule I to the principal Order:—

(1) The following words shall be inserted at the end of paragraph 14:—

"The letters shall be without ornamentation and a hyphen shall be placed between the nationality mark and the registration mark."

(2) In paragraph 15 the last sentence shall be omitted.

(3) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 17:—

"17.—(a) The width of each letter and the length of the hyphen between the nationality mark and the registration mark shall be two-thirds of the height of the letters and the thickness of the lines forming the letters and the hyphen shall be one-sixth of that height;

(b) as nearly as the constructional features of the aircraft admit, each letter shall be separated from the letter which immediately precedes or follows it (the hyphen for this purpose being regarded as a letter) by a space equal to half the width of the individual letters; and

(c) In order to render the marks clearly legible the lines forming the letters and the hyphen shall be solid and of a uniform colour contrasting clearly with the background on which they are placed."

(4) Paragraph 18 shall be omitted.

Amendment of Schedule IV.

6. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule IV to the principal Order:—

(1) In sub-paragraph (4) of paragraph 17, sub-paragraph (c) shall be omitted.

(2) (a) The following title shall be substituted for the title of Section VI:—

"Special rules relating to aircraft on the surface or near the surface of the water."

(b) In paragraph 49:—

(i) The word "and" at the end of proviso (a) shall be omitted;

(ii) A comma shall be substituted for the full stop and the word "and" shall be inserted at the end of proviso (b); and

(iii) The following proviso shall be inserted after proviso (b):—

"(c) Every aircraft in flight or in process of manoeuvring near the surface of the water shall as far as possible keep clear of all vessels and avoid impeding the navigation thereof."

(3) The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph 50:—

"50A.—(1) The person in charge of an aircraft flying along an international air traffic route or on a regular line or service of public air transport shall—

(a) before the aircraft commences any flight, procure such information as will enable him to acquire knowledge of the general meteorological situation and of the way in which it is developing; and

(b) immediately before the departure of the aircraft on any flight ascertain, from such information as may be available at the aerodrome or other place of departure, what are the meteorological conditions anticipated along the routes he may follow for the period during which the aircraft will be flying and what are the latest observed meteorological conditions at places along such routes or at places so near to such routes as to render the meteorological conditions existing at those places significant for the purpose of the intended flight.

(2) If at any aerodrome from which an aircraft to which this paragraph relates is about to depart a forecasting service is in operation, the person in charge of the aircraft shall, for the purposes of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, consult personally the meteorologist employed on that service if he is available."

Citation and Commencement.

7.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1938.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1938.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in

accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66) have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Government of the Colony of Fiji (hereinafter referred to as the Colonial Government):—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall be made in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary of Fiji or other officer of the Colonial Government nominated by the Governor, or by one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship.

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built, and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name.

(iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Colonial Government, or by purchase, capture, condemnation, or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Colonial Government.

(iv) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall—

(i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Government of the Colony of Fiji" and shall also enter therein:

(ii) the name of the port to which she belongs;

(iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration;

(iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by Bill of Sale, the Colonial Government shall be the transferors, and the Bill of Sale shall be a Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vict. c. 60), hereinafter called the principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be signed by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of

the Colonial Government by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

6. The person to whom the management of any Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government is entrusted by the Colonial Government shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the principal Act.

7. Where any provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship such duty, liability, right or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Colonial Government on behalf of His Majesty.

8. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order, applicable to Government ships.

9. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government registered in pursuance of this Order, namely:—

(i) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894—Sections 1, 8 to 12. The provisions of Part II of the Act relating to the requirement of officers to hold certificates of competency and the production of these certificates.

(ii) The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44)—Sections 3 and 5.

(iii) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906—Sections 25 and 27.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government, shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

10. Anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Colonial Government may be done by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Section 21 (1) (a) of the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, His Majesty The King in Council is authorised to make regulations prohibiting or restricting the exercise by

marriage officers of their powers under the Act in places where sufficient facilities appear to His Majesty to exist without the exercise of those powers for the solemnization of marriages to which a British subject is a party:

And whereas by Section 21 (2) of the said Act it is provided that regulations made in pursuance of the said Section may be made *inter alia* with reference to any particular class of cases:

And whereas it appears that without the exercise of their powers under the said Act by marriage officers in China sufficient facilities exist under the forms of marriage referred to in Sections 12 and 22 of the said Act for marriages in China of British subjects who are serving in China in His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces or in the Royal Air Force:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with in respect of the regulations hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) This Order may be cited as the Foreign Marriages (China) Order in Council, 1938.

(2) No marriage officer in China shall solemnize any marriage between parties either of whom is serving in China in His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces or the Royal Air Force.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the powers as a marriage officer under Section 12 of the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, of any commanding officer of any of His Majesty's ships.

WHEREAS by Article (1) of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (General Application to His Majesty's dominions etc.) Order, 1933 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1933, No. 1073), it is provided that Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933 (23 Geo. 5 c. 13), shall apply to His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom and to judgments obtained in the Courts of the said dominions:

And whereas by an Act of the Indian Legislature (being Act No. VIII of 1937) entitled the Code of Civil Procedure (Amendment) Act, 1937, section 44A has been inserted in the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, and by sub-section (1) of that section it is provided that where a certified copy of a decree of any of the Superior

Courts of the United Kingdom has been filed in a District Court the decree may be executed in British India as if it had been passed by the District Court:

And whereas subsequently to the passing of the said Act VIII of 1937 Burma ceased to be part of India and the Government of Burma Act came into force, namely, on the 1st April, 1937:

And whereas the said Act VIII of 1937 has effect in British Burma subject to the adaptations and modifications provided in the Government of Burma (Adaptation of Laws) Order, 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1937, No. 265), and, in particular, Articles 5 and 7 and the Schedule to the said Order as modified by the Schedule to the Government of Burma (Adaptation of Laws) Supplementary Order, 1937 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1937, No. 701):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that in the event of Part I of the said Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, being extended to judgments given in the superior courts of British India and British Burma substantial reciprocity of treatment will, under the terms of the said Act VIII of 1937, be assured as respects the enforcement in British India and in British Burma of judgments given in the superior courts of the United Kingdom; and is accordingly minded to direct that the said Part I shall extend to British India and to British Burma:

And whereas it is expedient to specify the Courts in British India and in British Burma which are for the purposes of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, to be deemed superior courts:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of His powers under the said Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (British India and British Burma) Order, 1938," and shall come into operation on the 19th November, 1938.

2. Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, shall extend to British India and to British Burma.

3. The following courts of British India shall be deemed superior courts of British India for the purposes of Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, that is to say:—

(a) The High Courts in Calcutta, Madras, Bombay, Allahabad, Lahore, Patna and Nagpur, the Chief Court in Oudh, the Judicial Commissioner's Courts in the North-West Frontier Province and in Sind, any other Court in British India constituted or reconstituted under Chapter II of Part IX of the Government of India Act, 1935, as a High Court and any other comparable Court in British India which His Majesty in Council may declare to be a High Court for the purposes of that Act.

(b) All District Courts.

(c) All other Courts whose civil jurisdiction is subject to no pecuniary limit, provided that the judgment sought to be registered under the said Act of 1933 is sealed

with a seal showing that the jurisdiction of the Court is subject to no pecuniary limit.

4. The following courts of British Burma shall be deemed superior courts of British Burma for the purposes of Part I of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933, that is to say:—

(a) The High Court.

(b) All District Courts.

WHEREAS a Convention on the Execution of Foreign Arbitral Awards was on the twenty-sixth day of September nineteen hundred and twenty-seven signed at Geneva on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) Act, 1930, it is provided that Part 1 of that Act applies to any award made after the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-four

(a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Senate of the Free City of Danzig in respect of the Free City of Danzig:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. The President of the Polish Republic, for the Free City of Danzig, is a party to the said Convention.

2. The territory of the Free City of Danzig is a territory to which the said Convention applies.

3. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 2 Order, 1938, and shall come into force on the 4th day of November, 1938.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of November, 1884 (hereinafter in this Order referred to as "the Principal Order"), it was ordered that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the group of British Possessions therein mentioned, that is to say, Jamaica, the Turks and Caicos Islands, British Guiana, Trinidad, the Leeward Islands, Barbados, St. Vincent, Grenada, St. Lucia, Tobago, the Bahamas, and British Honduras:

And whereas it is expedient that the Cayman Islands should be included in the group of British Possessions to which Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, was applied by the Principal Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Principal Order shall, with effect from the date of this Order, be read and construed as if the Cayman Islands were included in the group of British Possessions mentioned in the said Order.

2. The Governor of Jamaica shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies including the Turks and Caicos Islands and the Cayman Islands, and the Governors of the other Possessions mentioned in the Principal Order shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Colonies under their respective Governments.

WHEREAS the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925, 1927 and 1935 (hereinafter called "the principal Order") made provision for the establishment of a High Commissioner for Transport for the Colony and

Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda and for matters relating thereto:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Orders, as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects:—

(1) By the addition to Article 3 of the following paragraph:—

"(3) It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner, in accordance with the provisions of any Ordinance passed by the legislatures of Kenya and Uganda, to enter into such agreements as may be considered expedient relating to the ownership, control, working or management of any railway, road motor services, aircraft services, ports, harbours, wharves or steamship services, with any person, persons, corporate body or authority concerned in such ownership; control, working or management. The rights, liabilities and interests of the High Commissioner under any such Agreement shall form part of the Services for the purposes of this Order, and accordingly moneys of the Railway and Harbour Fund may be expended for the purposes of, or in connection with, such Agreements."

(2) By the deletion of paragraph (c) of Article 7 and the substitution therefor of the following:—

"(c) The grant of pensions, gratuities and other like allowances to servants and their dependants and the grant of gratuities to the estates of deceased servants; the establishment of sick funds, pensions and superannuation funds, and provident funds, the scale and payment of contributions thereto, the scale of benefits and the payment thereof to, on behalf of, or in respect of servants and their dependants, and the method of administering such funds; the liability, or otherwise, to assignment, attachment, sequestration and other levy, of sums payable to a servant or any other person under regulations made in pursuance of this paragraph; and such additional matters relating to those referred to in this paragraph as the High Commissioner may think desirable."

2. For the removal of doubts it is hereby declared that all regulations and rules made by the High Commissioner before the date of this Order and purporting to be made under paragraph (c) of Article 7 of the principal Order shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, as valid and effectual as they would have been had they been regulations made after the date of this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Amendment Order in Council, 1938, and shall be construed as one with the principal Order, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Orders in Council, 1925 to 1938.

And whereas by subsection (1) of Section 1 of the Carriage by Air Act, 1932, as extended by the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1934, to the Colonies and other territories mentioned in the second schedule to that Order, it is provided that as from such day as His Majesty may by Order in Council certify to be the day on which the said Convention comes into force as regards the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid, the provisions of the said Convention as set out in the first annex to the first schedule to the said Order shall, so far as they relate to the rights and liabilities of carriers, passengers, consignors, consignees, and other persons and subject to the provisions of that Section, have the force of law in the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid in relation to any carriage by air to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas by the Carriage by Air (Aden) Order, 1938, the second schedule to the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1934, was amended by the insertion at the commencement thereof of the words "Aden (Colony and Protectorate)":

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. It is hereby certified that the said Convention comes into force as regards the Aden Protectorate, on the 13th day of December, 1938.

2. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Aden Protectorate) (Date of Coming into Force of Convention) Order, 1938.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Whipton, situate within the Parish of Heavitree, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the Parish of Pinhoe, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the said Parish of Pinhoe should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Whipton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Pinhoe (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter in Exeter, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Heavitree (in witness whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the said Parish of Pinhoe which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, Whipton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Whipton.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Whipton, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Heavitree in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Exeter, upon the north east by the Parish of Pinhoe, upon the south east by the Parish of Sowton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south west, by an imaginary line

commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sowton from the said Parish of Heavitree at a point in the middle of the northern end of the bridge which carries the Exmouth Branch Line of the Southern Railway across the main road from Exeter to Honiton, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 17 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Heavitree from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Exeter.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Pinhoe which is bounded upon the south, upon the west and upon the north by the above described portion of the said Parish of Heavitree and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Heavitree from the said Parish of Pinhoe at the junction of Pinhoe Road with Hill Barton Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Hill Barton Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hollow Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Pinhoe from the said Parish of Heavitree."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Lord Bishop of Southwark, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I Richard Godfrey by Divine Permission Bishop of Southwark do in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria cap. 106 and of the first Section of the Act of Parliament of the fiftieth and fifty-first years of the same reign cap. 68 hereby represent to your Grace:

"There is in the County of Surrey and my Diocese of Southwark the Vicarage of Malden the Parish whereof comprises amongst other places the Chapelry of Chessington to which abuts another detached portion of the Parish of Malden at one time known as 'The Rushots'. The limits of the said Chapelry and detached portion of the Parish of Malden aforesaid are well known and defined and have

been and are now known collectively as the Civil Parish of Chessington.

"That the said Chapelry contains a duly consecrated Church or Chapel long since erected which is distant from the Parish Church of Malden three and a half miles or thereabouts.

"That Divine Service is performed in the said Church or Chapel at Chessington by a duly licensed stipendiary Curate nominated by the Incumbent of Malden.

"That the said Chapelry of Chessington with the detached portion of the Parish of Malden aforesaid adjoining appears to have been from time immemorial treated as a separate and distinct Parish for all civil purposes and Baptisms Churchings and Marriages and Burials have been for a long series of years and now are solemnised and performed in the said Church or Chapel of the said Chapelry and the burial ground thereto belonging and that the said Chapelry has its own Churchwardens and Parochial Church Council.

"That there is a House of Residence in the said Chapelry which is occupied by the duly licensed Curate performing the duties in the said Chapelry.

"That the gross and net annual income of the said Vicarage of Malden with the Chapelry of Chessington (exclusive of the value of the Vicarage House at Malden and the house of residence at Chessington) amounts to not less than nine hundred and seventy-four pounds one shilling and sixpence and includes:

"Upon the present Incumbent vacating the Benefice the payment in lieu of tithe rentcharge arising in the Tithe District of Malden will be

reduced to approximately sixty-one pounds and that in respect of the Tithe District of Chessington to approximately one hundred and ninety pounds.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or land owners of Malden possess any legal right by Faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the Church or Chapel of Chessington or that any of the inhabitants or land owners of Chessington possess any legal right by Faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the said Church of Malden.

"That the Patronage of the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Malden with the said Chapelry belongs to the Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton in the University of Oxford.

"That the Reverend Stewart Wemyss Gibson Frost is the present Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Malden with the said Chapelry of Chessington.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament hereinbefore mentioned the said Chapelry of Chessington and the detached portion of the Parish of Malden hereinbefore referred to may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage and Parish Church of Malden and be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the first hereinbefore mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said Chapelry of Chessington and the detached portion of the Parish of Malden so proposed to be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice and the mode in which it appears to me such constitution may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands payments in lieu of Tithes or Tithe Rentcharges dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons and Incumbent of the said Parish of Malden and of the Lord Bishop of Guildford and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the said Patrons Incumbent and Bishop thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the said Chapelry of Chessington together with the detached portion of the Parish of Malden at one time known as 'The Rushots' shall be separated from the said Parish of Malden to which they now belong and that the same shall be constituted a separate Parish for Ecclesiastical purposes and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice by the name and style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Chessington' of which the said Church or Chapel situate therein shall be the Parish

Church. Such Church or Chapel and the Churchyard surrounding the same are coloured pink on the plan annexed hereto and such Chapelry and detached portion are shown on the said plan within the red verge line.

"That the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington shall no longer form part of the Diocese of Southwark but shall be annexed to and form part of the Diocese of Guildford and the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Guildford shall have vested in him the Ecclesiastical jurisdiction of such separate Parish and Benefice. The said separate Parish and Benefice shall form part of the Rural Deanery of Epsom and of the Archdeaconry of Dorking.

"That the Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same and shall be entitled to perform Baptisms Churchings Marriages and Burials in the Church of the Benefice so to be constituted and to receive the fees for such offices and all Ecclesiastical dues and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said Benefice.

"That the Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall in addition to such fees dues offerings and emoluments as aforesaid henceforth be entitled to receive the following income or such income as may in future be substituted therefor namely:—

and the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the Augmentation of the Maintenance of the Poor Clergy and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England respectively shall transfer the above mentioned Funds in their books from the said Benefice of Malden to the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington.

"That during the Incumbency of the Reverend Stewart Wemyss Gibson Frost he shall pay to the Incumbent for the time being of the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington the annual sum of twenty-five pounds by half-yearly payments on the first day of January and the first day of July such annual sum being a charge upon the glebe lands and revenues of the said Benefice of Malden. In case the said annual sum of

twenty-five pounds or any part thereof shall at any time be in arrear and unpaid for the space of twenty-one days next after any of the dates hereby appointed for payment thereof as aforesaid then and in every such case it shall be lawful for the Incumbent for the time being of the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington to recover the amount due to him either by action of debt against the said Stewart Wemyss Gibson Frost or at his option to enter into and upon all or any of the glebe lands hereditaments and premises hereby charged with the said annual sum of twenty-five pounds and to distrain for the same and all arrears thereof and to dispose of the distress or distresses there found and taken or otherwise to act in the premises as in the case of a distress taken for rent in arrear reserved upon a common demise. And further that if and whenever any part of the said annual sum of twenty-five pounds shall be arrear and unpaid for the space of twenty-eight days next after any of the days appointed for payment thereof and so often as the same shall happen and although there should not have been any legal demand made therefor or the arrears thereof it shall be lawful for the Incumbent for the time being of the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington to enter into and upon and take receive and enjoy all and every or any part of the said glebe lands and hereditaments and premises hereby charged with the said annual sum of twenty-five pounds as aforesaid for his own use until he shall therewith or thereby or by such distress or distresses as aforesaid or otherwise be fully paid the said annual sum of twenty-five pounds hereby charged as aforesaid and all arrears thereof and all arrears to become due during the time of his being in possession of the premises together with all costs and expenses of in or about the letting or management of the said premises occasioned by the non-payment thereof. Provided always that upon the said Stewart Wemyss Gibson Frost vacating the said Benefice of Malden then the annual sum of twenty-five pounds hereby charged upon the glebe lands and revenues of the said Benefice of Malden shall cease to be payable and become void.

"That the House of Residence at present occupied by the duly licensed stipendiary Curate officiating in the said Chapelry of Chessington shall be and become the Parsonage House or House of Residence of the Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Benefice. Such House of Residence and the grounds thereto attached are coloured yellow on the said plan.

"That the glebe lands situate within the said separate Parish and belonging to the Vicarage of Malden shall henceforth be and become glebe lands belonging to the said separate Parish and Benefice. Such glebe lands are coloured green on the said plan.

"That except as aforesaid no change shall be made by this Scheme in respect of the glebe lands payments in lieu of Tithes or Tithe Rentcharges or other endowments or emoluments of the said Vicarage of Malden.

"That the Patronage and Right of Nomination of a Minister or Incumbent to the said Parish and Benefice of Chessington shall be vested in the said Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton in the

University of Oxford in the same manner as the Advowson or Right of Patronage of the entire Benefice is at present vested.

"That the inhabitants of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Malden aforesaid (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington.

"That the inhabitants of the said separate Parish and Benefice shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms and Churchings solemnized and performed in the Church of the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington.

" CONSENTS.

"We the Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton in the University of Oxford the Patrons or persons now entitled to present to the Vicarage of Malden in the County of Surrey and Diocese of Southwark in case the same were now vacant the Reverend Stewart Wemyss Gibson Frost the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Malden and John Victor by Divine Permission Bishop of Guildford being the Bishop of the Diocese to which it is proposed the said separate Parish and Benefice of Chessington shall be annexed do hereby respectively signify our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we the said Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton in the University of Oxford have hereunto affixed our Seal and we the other consenting parties have hereunto set our hands this thirtieth day of September One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

"The Common Seal of Merton College, Oxford, was affixed hereto in my presence.

Throughout the existing Regulations insert "Principal" before "Act" wherever the word "Act" occurs, except in Regulation 1 (1) and (2) and Regulation 27.

Regulation 1 (1). In the first paragraph for "the Act" substitute "the Acts" and for "The Architects (Registration) Act, 1931" substitute "The Architects (Registration) Acts, 1931 to 1938". At the end of the first paragraph insert "The expression 'Principal Act'

means the Architects (Registration) Act, 1931". In the third paragraph for "Act" substitute "Acts".

2. For "September" substitute "October".
10. After "in appointing such Committee" insert "shall have". After "regard" delete "shall be had".

14. After "in appointing such Committee" insert "shall have" and after "regard" delete "shall be had".

17. After "pursuance" substitute "of" for "to".

21.—(a) For "one month" substitute "three months".

26. Delete Regulation 26 and insert—

26. A person shall be eligible to apply for Registration under the principal Act (1) if he shall have passed any examination held in pursuance of Section 6 (4) of the principal Act, or (2) if his application for Registration be made before the 1st August 1940, and if on the 1st August 1938 he was an Architectural Assistant and at that date had been engaged in the study of Architecture and execution of architectural work in the United Kingdom for at least seven years, or (3) if he shall at any time (whether before or after the recognition by the Council of the examination) have passed any of the examinations in architecture specified in the Second Schedule to these Regulations (being the examinations recognised by the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Architectural Education), or (4) if, having previously resigned from the Register and having at the date of his resignation paid all fees due and outstanding and any penalty payable under Section 13 (5) of the principal Act, he applies for re-admission to the Register.

28. Insert "first" before "Schedule".

36 and 37. Delete Regulations 36 and 37 and substitute—

36.—(a) Applications for registration under Section 6 of the principal Act.

The fee to be paid by an applicant shall be ten shillings for the years 1939 and 1940 respectively and thereafter six shillings and eightpence. The said fee shall be paid by the applicant at the time of his application but shall be repaid to him in the event of his application being refused.

(b) Applications for registration under Section 2 of the Architects Registration Act, 1938.

The fee to be paid by the applicant shall be ten shillings for the years 1939 and 1940 respectively and thereafter six shillings and eightpence. The said fee shall be paid by the applicant at the time of his application but shall be repaid to him in the event of his application being refused.

In the County of Gloucester—

The parishes of Alvington, Hewelsfield and St. Briavels in the rural district of Lydney and so much of the parish of Woolaston in that rural district as is not within the existing limits;

(hereinafter called "the added limits") and to provide that subject to the provisions of the intended Order the Company shall have and may exercise within the added limits or any part or parts thereof all powers rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply or some part or parts thereof.

2. To authorise the purchase by the Company of the gas undertaking of the Caldicot and District Gas Light and Coke Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Caldicot Company") upon the terms (with or without modification) of an agreement dated the 6th day of September, 1938, and made between the Caldicot Company of the one part and the Company of the other part, and to vest the said undertaking in the Company.

3. To authorise the Company to create and issue such nominal amount of stock as may be requisite to give effect to the provisions of the intended Order and to make provision as to the ranking of such stock for dividend.

4. To make provision for the continuance of actions, arbitrations or proceedings pending at the day of completion of the transfer of the said undertaking and in regard to existing contracts and other instruments, and the collection of outstanding debts, and to provide that the books and documents relating to the said undertaking shall remain evidence and that the officers of the Caldicot Company shall be accountable for such books and documents, to make provision as to the compensation payable to employees of the Caldicot Company and to make such other provision as may be deemed necessary or expedient for or in connection with or in consequence of the said purchase and transfer.

5. To extend to the undertaking of the Company some of the provisions of the Caldicot and District Gas Order, 1908, to authorise the Company to exercise such of the powers conferred by the said Caldicot and District Gas Order, 1908, as the Order may prescribe, and to provide for the repeal of the remainder of the said provisions and of the Caldicot and District Gas (Charges) Order, 1923.

6. To amend the provisions of section 23 (Power to Company to raise additional capital) of the Chepstow Gas Act, 1918.

7. To prescribe the borrowing powers of the Company, to extend to such powers certain provisions applicable to the Company's existing powers and to make provision as to the priority of money raised by the issue of mortgages and debenture stock.
