And whereas by subsection (1) of Section 1 of the Carriage by Air Act, 1932, as extended by the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1934, to the Colonies and other territories mentioned in the second schedule to that Order, it is provided that as from such day as His Majesty may by Order in Council certify to be the day on which the said Convention comes into force as regards the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid, the provisions of the said Convention as set out in the first annex to the first schedule to the said Order shall, so far as they relate to the rights and liabilities of carriers, passengers, consignors, consignees, and other persons and subject to the provisions of that Section, have the force of law in the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid in relation to any carriage by air to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas by the Carriage by Air (Aden) Order, 1938, the second schedule to the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1934, was Mandated amended by the insertion at the commencement thereof of the words "Aden (Colony and

Protectorate) ":

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. It is hereby certified that the said Convention comes into force as regards the Aden Protectorate, on the 13th day of December,

2. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Aden Protectorate) (Date of Coming into Force of Convention) Order, 1938.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th Years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70; of the Act of the 14th and 15th Years of Her said late 14th and Majesty, Chapter 97; and of the Act of the 19th and 20th Years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 55; duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of October, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to-

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Whipton, situate within the Parish of Heavitree, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the Parish of Pinhoe, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the

several churches of such Parishes:

And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain configuous portions (being the portions containing the population afore-said) of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the said Parish of Pinhoe should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints,

Whipton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Pinhoe (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter in Exeter, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Heavitree (in witness whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Heavitree and of the said Parish of Pinhoe which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, which portions, together with boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, Whipton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Whipton.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Whipton, comprising:-

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Heavitree in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Exeter, upon the north east by the Parish of Pinhoe, upon the south east by the Parish of Sowton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south west, by an imaginary line
