ROAD HAULAGE WAGES ACT, 1938.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Labour, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the First Schedule to the Road Haulage Wages Act, 1938, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the Road Haulage Central Wages Board (Meetings and Proceedings) Regulations, 1938, and the Road Haulage Area Wages Boards (Meetings and Proceedings) Regulations, 1938, with regard to the meetings and proceedings of the Road Haulage Central Wages Board and of Road Haulage Area Wages Boards.
