THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS 1913 AND 1931.

PRESERVATION ORDER in relation to part of the Roman Wall in the Parish of Walltown in the County of Northumberland.

Whereas by Section 6 (1) of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913, it is enacted that if the Ancient Monuments Board constituted under the Act report to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings (in the Act and hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners of Works) that any monument is in danger of destruction or removal or damage from neglect or injudicious treatment, and that the preservation of the monument is of national importance, the Commissioners of Works may, if they think fit, and if it appears to them that the monument is an ancient monument within the meaning of the Act, make an Order (in the Act referred to as a Preservation Order) placing the monument under the protection of the Commissioners of Works: Provided that, if in any case the Commissioners of Works consider that the making of such an Order is a matter of immediate urgency, the Commissioners of Works may make the Order without receiving any such report as aforesaid.

And whereas the Commissioners of Works consider that the monument hereinafter mentioned is in danger of destruction or removal, and that the preservation thereof is of national importance, and that the making of an Order for its preservation is a matter of immediate urgency.

Now therefore the Commissioners of Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Ancient Monuments Acts, 1913 and 1931, and of every other power them thereunto enabling, do hereby Order that the part of the Roman Wall in the Parish of Walltown in the County of Northumberland the site whereof is delineated and shown upon the plan attached hereto, being in the opinion of the Commissioners of Works an ancient monument within the meaning of the said Acts, shall as from the date hereof be placed under the protection of the Commissioners of Works.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

The Board of Trade hereby give notice that they have renewed for a further term of twelve months twenty-eight Prospecting Licences granted under the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, to the D'Arcy Exploration Company Limited, of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2.
