A PROCLAMATION

WITHDRAWING THE PROCLAMATIONS OF THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1938, CALLING OUT OFFICERS OF THE RETIRED AND EMERGENCY LISTS OF THE ROYAL NAVY AND ROYAL MARINES AND THE SPECIAL RESERVE OF ENGINEER OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL NAVY, OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL NAVAL RESERVE, AND MEN OF THE ROYAL NAVAL RESERVE AND THE ROYAL FLEET RESERVE AND OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE ROYAL NAVAL VOLUNTEER RESERVE, AND EXTENDING THE TERM OF SERVICE OF SEAMEN SERVING IN THE ROYAL NAVY AND OF MARINES SERVING IN THE ROYAL MARINE FORCES.

Whereas by Our Proclamations of the Twenty-eighth day of September, 1938, We ordered and directed that Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers of the Royal Navy should hold themselves in readiness for actual service, and that Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and Volunteers under the Royal Naval Reserve (Volunteer) Act, 1859, the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1896, the Naval Reserve Act, 1900, and the Naval Forces Act, 1903, should be called out for or into actual service:

And whereas the state of Public Affairs now admits of the withdrawal of Our said Proclamations:

We do hereby withdraw Our said Proclamations and do release all the said Officers and Volunteers from actual service thereunder.

And whereas by Our further Proclamation of the said Twenty-eighth day of September, 1938, We ordered and directed that every seaman and marine who was then serving in the Royal Navy or in the Royal Marine Forces, being a seaman whose term of service, or a marine whose first or second term of limited service, had expired or might expire while that Proclamation should continue in force should be required to serve for a period of five years from the expiration of his said term of service, if his services were so long required:

We do also further hereby withdraw Our said Proclamation and do release from further service all men affected thereby.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Twenty-fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and in the Second year of Our Reign.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

CANCELLATION OF SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(JOHN JOSEPH COGHLAN.)

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, the Authorities granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the drugs to which the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, apply, were, by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 24th June, 1930, withdrawn from John Joseph Coghlan, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., then of 98, Station Road, New Barnet, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas by the said Notice it was directed that it should not be lawful for the said John Joseph Coghlan to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937:

And whereas the operation of the said Notice was by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 8th May, 1936, suspended until further Order:

And whereas I am of opinion that the said John Joseph Coghlan cannot properly be allowed for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium, etc. Regulations, 1937, to remain an authorised person or to give prescriptions:

Now therefore I hereby cancel, as from today's date, the Notice of Suspension published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 8th May, 1936.

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the said recited Act, do hereby order that the West Coroner's District and the North, East and South Coroner's District of the County shall cease to exist and that the County shall no longer be divided into Coroners' districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of December, 1938.

To incorporate and apply, with or without modifications, or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the following, amongst other, public Acts—the Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870; the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1936; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.

(Redefinition of existing water limits; Retention sale, etc., of lands; Additional borrowing powers and other financial provisions; Provisions as to rates and charges; provisions regulating the supply of water and works incidental thereto; Amendment of section 35 of Waterworks Clauses Act 1847; breaking up of streets, etc.; entry on premises; Administrative provisions; Miscellaneous provisions and powers to Undertakers; penalties; Incorporation repeal and amendment of Acts &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Minister of Health on or before the 23rd day of December next by the South Kent Water Company (hereinafter called "the Undertakers") for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Gas and Water Works Facilities Act 1870 and the Gas and Water Works Facilities Act 1870 Amendment Act 1873 for the purposes following or some of them:

1. To redefine the existing limits of the Undertakers for the supply of water authorised by the South Kent Water Act 1889 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1889") as amended by subsequent enactments in terms of the present local government districts comprised in such limits.

2. To empower the Undertakers notwithstanding the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts to retain, hold, use, sell, lease, exchange

5. To make new provisions as to the sale of capital of the Undertakers by auction or tender.

6. To empower the directors of the Undertakers (hereinafter called "the directors") to issue so as to be redeemable preference shares and stock and debenture stock. To make provisions with respect to the redemption of such shares and stock either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other shares or stock (redeemable or otherwise) and authorising the creation and issue of new shares and stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference shares or stock and debenture stock after redemption.

7. To make provision for the application of moneys raised under any Act or Order relating to the Undertakers; for limiting the aggregate amount to be carried in any year to any reserved or contingency fund and the amount to be carried forward at the end of any year to the credit of profit and loss account; as to receipts in case of persons not *sui juris*; and with respect to other financial matters.

8. To amend sub-section (2) of Section 6 (Additional percentage of rates rents and charges) of the South Kent Water Order 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1920") and extend and apply the same as so amended to the variation of any of the rates rents and charges for the supply of water authorised by the Order.

9. To amend Section 72 (Owners of houses not exceeding £10 rent to be liable to water rates) of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1847 in its application to the Undertakers.

10. To empower the Undertakers to require water rates to be paid by owners of small houses or houses let to tenants on less than a quarterly tenancy.

11. To provide that the Undertakers may in the case of houses partly used for trade or manufacturing purposes and of certain classes of buildings institutions and premises and of farmhouses require water to be taken and paid for by measure.

12. To authorise the Undertakers to make special or increased charges for water used in stables garages and premises where horses carriages or motor cars are kept, and also in cases where water is used for or in connection with refrigerating and other apparatus or for other special purposes.

13. To authorise the Undertakers to supply water for purposes other than those with respect to which owners and occupiers are compellable by the Undertakers under the provisions of the Act of 1889 the South Kent Water Order 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1910") and the Order of 1920 to

accept a supply by meter and than those specified in certain provisions of the Order at such rates as may be agreed between the consumer and the Undertakers and by agreement to supply water by measure either for domestic or other purposes.

14. To make provision for determining the amount of water rate chargeable by the Undertakers in respect of any supply of water where two or more houses or buildings or parts thereof respectively are in one occupation.

15. To require the provision of cisterns of such minimum capacity as the Order may specify in any dwelling house to be erected on land situate at a higher level than may be prescribed by the Order and to relieve the Undertakers from any obligation to afford such supply until such cisterns are provided.

16. To amend Section 57 (Power to surveyor employed by Undertakers to enter houses to inspect &c.) of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1847, in its application to the Undertakers.

17. To amend Section 35 (A constant supply of water to be kept for domestic purposes at high pressure) of the Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847, in its application to the Undertakers.

18. To authorise the Undertakers for the purpose of measuring water supplied or preventing, etc. waste to affix and maintain meters and other apparatus on their service pipes and mains and stopcocks in supply pipes and to insert in roads and footways covers and boxes and for that purpose to break up and interfere with streets roads and other property.

19. To make new or additional provisions with respect to the following matters: the making and confirmation of byelaws for preventing waste, etc., of water and as to the testing and stamping of fittings and apparatus and the charges therefor; the penalties for forging or counterfeiting stamps or marks used by or under the authority of the Undertakers and for using or supplying articles with any such stamp or mark knowing the same to be forged or counterfeited; register of meters to be *prima facie* evidence of the quantity of water consumed; the period of error in defective meters; the imposition of penalties in the case of any person injuring any fittings or pipe or any meter or other instrument for measuring water or fraudulently altering the index of any such meter or instrument or preventing the same from registering or fraudulently abstracting consuming or using water; the imposition of penalties for opening or closing valves or other apparatus without the authority of the Undertakers and for other breaches of the provisions of the Order.

To make further provision with respect to the laying, repairing, maintaining and renewing of communication pipes and apparatus connected therewith and the making of connections between communication or service pipes and the mains of the Undertakers including the conferment upon the Undertakers of the exclusive right to make such communications and with respect to requiring (in the case of all buildings the erection of which is commenced after the commencement of the Order) the insertion in communication pipes and maintenance of stopcocks covers and boxes; to confer on the Undertakers powers with respect to the execution of such works (whether by agreement with owners and occupiers or otherwise) and the

recovery of the cost thereof from owners or occupiers; and to impose or confer on owners and occupiers and other persons obligations with respect to the matters aforesaid and powers of breaking open streets roads and other property.

21. To amend Section 47 (Company not bound to supply several houses by one pipe) of the Act of 1889 and empower the Undertakers in case of the owner's default under that section themselves to execute the necessary works and recover the cost thereof from the owner.

22. To authorise the Undertakers to purchase and use for the purposes of their undertaking water in bulk from any authority company body or person.

23. To authorise the Undertakers to demand payment of water rates in advance by equal quarterly payments.

24. To make special provisions as to the supply of water to caravans shacks huts tents and similar structures and as to the terms and conditions of any such supply.

25. To make new or further provisions with reference to the Undertakers' affairs including provisions as to:—the holding of annual meetings, the notices of meetings, the register of shareholders and shareholders' address book, the appointment of proxies, joint holders, the closing of transfer books, the qualification of directors, directors holding office under or contracting with the Undertakers, and the notice of candidature of or of opposition to re-election of directors.

26. To make new provisions as to the number, qualification and election of the auditors of the Undertakers and the notice of candidature of auditors, and to empower the Directors to fill occasional vacancies in the office of auditor and to determine the remuneration of the auditors.

27. To make provisions with respect to the payment of half-yearly dividends by the Directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and with respect to the accounts of the Undertakers.

28. To authorise the directors to grant superannuation and other allowances gratuities and pensions and to make other payments to employees, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with insurance companies and others for securing such gratuities pensions and other payments; to subscribe to hospitals and other charitable objects and to the benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Undertakers; and to apply the revenues of the Undertakers for all or any of those purposes.

29. To make provision as to the authentication and service of notices by the Undertakers; the recovery of demands and penalties; the inclusion of several sums in one summons; and to provide that penalties shall not be cumulative and that judges and justices shall not be disqualified by reason of liability to the payment of water rates or charges.

30. To confer upon the Undertakers all powers usually conferred upon water companies and all such further or other powers and to make all such further or other provisions as may be necessary or expedient for more effectually securing the objects of the Order and to vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

31. To repeal, alter, or amend all or any of the provisions of the Act of 1889 the Order of 1910 and the Order of 1920.

32. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Companies Clauses Acts 1845 and 1863 and the Waterworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1863.
