

boundaries of the close numbered 1615 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 18½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence crosses the middle of the stream which flows into Sheffield Lane Dike, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sheffield Lane Dike, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of Sheffield Lane Dike for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hartley Brook Dike, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Hartley Brook Dike for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ecclesfield from the said District of Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for assigning the right of Patronage of the District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of December, 1936, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of January, 1937, the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned

Act, constituted out of the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Plaistow, in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas no assignment of the Patronage of the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, was made by the said Order and no such assignment has since been made:

"And whereas a capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Cedd, Canning Town, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.
