TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th December, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th December, 1938, to Saturday, the 17th December, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

MODIFICATION OF OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L.168.

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods, including *inter alia* aircraft and aircraft engines, is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas the Open General Export Licence No. G.L.168, issued by the Board of Trade on the 14th July, 1937, permits the exportation of certain aircraft and aircraft engines from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland (including any aerodrome approved by the Secretary of State as a Customs aerodrome under Schedule VIII of the Air Navigation (Consolidation Order, 1923) to all destinations other than Ethiopia, Spain, Spanish possessions or the Spanish Zone of Morocco;

And whereas it is desirable that the said Open General Export Licence should hereafter apply to all destinations in Italian East Africa:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby direct and declare that the scope of the said Open General Export Licence No. G.L.168 is extended, with effect from the

date hereof, so as to permit the export of the aircraft and aircraft engines to which the said Licence applies to all destinations other than Spain, Spanish possessions, or the Spanish Zone of Morocco.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1935 TO 1938.

"WET TIME" SCHEME FOR THE BUILDING INDUSTRY.

The National Joint Council for the Building Industry has submitted to the Minister of Labour for approval under Section 72 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1935, a Scheme entitled the Building Industry Supplementary Unemployment Insurance Scheme. The Scheme is designed to provide for the payment of "wet-time benefit" to workers in the building industry in respect of time lost owing to inclement weather, such payments to be made out of a fund formed by the compulsory collection of contributions from employers and work-people in the Building Industry. The Minister desires to afford persons who would be affected by the Scheme an opportunity to express their views.

Captain George Eric Maxia O'Donnell, Royal Navy. Late Chief Staff Officer to the Rear-Admiral, Yangtse.

This Officer was present in H.M.S. "Ladybird" during a bombing attack on British shipping at Wuhu on the 5th December, 1937.

Though painfully wounded in the right hand he placed himself under the orders of the Commanding Officer when the helmsman of H.M.S. "Ladybird" was hit, and took the wheel himself. Shortly afterwards, and with no regard for his own safety or his injury, he landed among hostile soldiery and proceeded to the shore Headquarters to protest, and was in time to prevent more than one round being fired at H.M.S. "Bee".

Lieutenant-Commander Harry Douglas Barlow, Royal Navy.

This Officer was in command of H.M.S. "Ladybird" during a bombing attack on British shipping at Wuhu on the 5th December, 1937. He was slightly wounded but acted with promptitude and decision in most trying conditions and used his ship and the Tug "Ohanyung" to the best advantage in attempting to save life and property.

In command of H.M.S. "Ladybird" during the attack on this ship and H.M.S. "Bee" at Wuhu on the 12th December, 1937, this Officer drew the fire of the shore batteries. He handled his ship ably, coolly, fearlessly and with resolution, showing complete disregard for his own safety, being only concerned with the safety of his ship and his ship's company.

Distinguished Service Cross.

Mr. Joseph William Hurst, O.B.E. Admiralty Pilot, Yangtse River.

On the morning of the 5th December, 1937, during the bombing of British shipping at Wuhu, Mr. Hurst took control of the Tug "Ohanyung", displaying remarkable powers of command over a panic-stricken native crew. By his seamanlike and fearless handling of the Tug he made possible the rescue of the ship's company of S.S. "Tuckwo" from a difficult and dangerous situation.

Distinguished Service Medal.

Officers' Steward First Class Yueng Chang Kaig.

In conjunction with Mr. Hurst he raised a scratch crew to man the Tug "Ohanyung" and was thereby instrumental in rescuing the crew of S.S. "Tuckwo".

Rear-Admiral Reginald Vesey Holt, C.B., D.S.O., M.V.O. Rear-Admiral and Senior Naval Officer, Yangtse.

On learning of the sinking of the U.S.S. "Panay" on the 13th December, 1937, he immediately went to her assistance. During the 13th and 14th December Rear-Admiral Holt personally conducted the search for the "Panay" survivors, on many occasions exposing himself to personal danger, and his actions throughout were gallant, forceful and successful.
