## LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*River Great Ouse Catchment Board.**Bedfordshire First Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the constitution of the Bedfordshire First Internal Drainage District and of a drainage board therefor, and for certain matters supplemental thereto, and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-one days from the date of this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament.

A copy of the sealed Order has been deposited, together with a copy of the Scheme, as amended, and of the map referred to therein, as amended, at the office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, Elmhurst, Brooklands Avenue, Cambridge, for public inspection for a period of thirty-one days from the date of this Notice, and may be inspected during the ordinary hours of business.
