ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated and December, 1938.)

No. 16/1938.

Whereas the Superintendent Registrars' districts of Great Ouseburn and York are each situate partly within and partly without the County Borough of York;

And whereas the parts of the aforesaid Superintendent Registrars' districts and the sub-districts and parts of sub-districts comprised therein which are situate without the aforesaid County Borough will on the 1st day of January, 1939, in consequence of and by virtue of the York Registration Scheme, 1938, made by the Council of the County Borough of York and approved by the Minister of Health under Section 24 of the Local Government Act, 1929, become separate Superintendent Registrars' districts and sub-districts respectively situate wholly without the said County Borough;

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the union of one of the Superintendent Registrar's districts so formed with another contiguous Superintendent Registrar's district and for the re-arrangement of the sub-districts comprised within the united Superintendent Registrar's district, and for the re-arrangement of the sub-districts comprised within the other Superintendent Registrar's district so formed;

And whereas it is necessary to transfer the functions under the Registration Acts in relation to the part of the Superintendent Registrar's district of York which is situate without the County Borough-of York;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, Section 21 (2) of the Local Government Act, 1929, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval

and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the York and York West Riding Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1938, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1939.
- (2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district and the terms "existing district" and "existing subdistrict" mean a district or sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of January, 1939.
- 2. That part of the existing York district which will on the 1st day of January, 1939, become a separate district situate wholly without the County Borough of York shall be united with the existing Tadcaster district.
- 3.—(1) That part of the Bishopthorpe subdistrict which will on the 1st day of January, 1939, become a separate sub-district situate wholly without the County Borough of York shall be added to and form part of the Tadcaster sub-district.
- (2) That part of the Acomb sub-district which will on the 1st day of January, 1939, become a separate sub-district situate wholly without the County Borough of York shall be added to and form part of the Whixley sub-district.
- 4. The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Tadcaster district shall be the Superintendent Registrar of that district as extended by Article 2 of this Order.
- 5. The registrars of the existing Tadcaster and Whixley sub-districts shall respectively be the registrars of those sub-districts as extended by this Order.
- 6. The functions under the Registration Acts in relation to that part of the existing York district which is united with the existing Tadcaster district by Article 2 of this Order are hereby transferred to the Council of the Administrative County of York, West Riding.
