The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT SURVEYORS, GRADE II, IN THE MAINTENANCE SURVEYORS' DIVISION OF H.M. OFFICE OF WORKS.

N.B.—*Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 32 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject; but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to
