the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said Parish of Saint Paul's Cray at the point 12 chains north of Cray's Farm where such boundary turns westward, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Paul's Cray from the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup) for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Sidcup By-pass Road opposite to the southern end of the footpath leading past the western side of the Crittall Window Frame Factory into Watery Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the Sidcup By-pass Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, from the said Parish of Chislehurst.

And also all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, which is bounded upon the west and upon the south by the said Parish of Chislehurst and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the northeast, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, at the junction of Sidcup Bypass Road with Chislehurst Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Sidcup By-pass Road for a distance of 39} chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, from the said Parish of Chisle-

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, com-

prising:-

"I. All that portion of the said Parish of Chislehurst which is bounded upon the southeast, upon the east, upon the north-east and upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, from the said Parish of Chielehumt at the impetion of Sides Parish of Chislehurst at the junction of Sidcup By-pass Road with Chislehurst Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Sidcup By-pass Road for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup.

"II. And also all that portion of the Parish of Foots Cray, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west and upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an line upon imaginary commencing boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, from the said Parish of Foots Cray at the junction of Foots Cray Lane with the road called The Drive, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Foots Cray Lane for a distance of 35 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the

house and premises known as Number 23 The Drive, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of certain houses and premises situate on the eastern side of The Drive, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Walton Road, and extending thence first northward across Walton Road to and then generally northward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of certain other houses and premises situate on the eastern side of The Drive and Lansdown Road for a distance in all of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence reaches the southern side of Birchwood Avenue, and extending thence first north-westward to and then first northeastward, then northward and then westward along the middle of Birchwood avenue for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Foots Cray from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey.

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, which is bounded upon the east by the said Parish of Foots Cray and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Foots Cray from the said New Parish of Saint John, Sidcup, at the junction of Cray Road with Sidcup By-pass Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Sidcup By-pass Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the western side of the Crittall Window Frame Factory into Watery Lane, and extending thence first northward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Watery Lane and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of Watery Lane for a distance of I chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Windsor Road and extending thence northward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Foots Cray Recreation Ground and extending thence first eastward, and then in various directions along the walls or fences forming the southern and eastern boundaries of the said recreation ground for a distance in all of 19½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Suffolk Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the Nursery situate to the north of such recreation ground for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the wall
