hereto shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other perposes as in the said Measures provided under the style of 'The Benefice of Dufton' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice).

- "2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union referred to in Clause I of this Scheme shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme.
- "3. That upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowment and property now belonging to the said Benefice of Long Marton namely a sum of £1.666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Long Marton shall be severed from the said Benefice of Long Marton and shall be annexed to the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them. in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"SCHEDULE.

"The part of the said Benefice of Long Marton proposed to be united to the said Benefice of Dufton being:—

"All that part of the said Benefice of Long Marton which lies to the north and north-east of an imaginary line following in part the middle of the footpath and lane leading from Grange Moor across Knock Moor towards Saint Cuthbert's Church, Dufton, and in part the middle of the stream flowing past Newlands into Swindale Beck, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured red."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Carlisle.
