said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, and of the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Stivichall.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Stivichall, in the Gounty of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry; comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south and upon the south-west by the said Parish of Stivichall and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said Parish of Stivichall, of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, and of the Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, in the said County and Diocese, all meet in the middle of the Coventry and Leamington Branch Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence first north-eastward, thennorthward and then north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry) for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Rugby to Birmingham Line of the same railway, and extending thence south-eastward along middle of the last mentioned line of railway (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry) for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Mile Lane across such railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Mile Lane for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Queen Isobel's Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Queen Isobel's Avenue for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Daventry Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Daventry Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Quinton Park, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said road called Quinton Park for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Black Prince Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Black Prince Avenue for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, from the said Parish of Stivichall.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry,

which is bounded upon the south-west by the said Parish of Stivichall, upon the south-east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Coventry, from the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, at the centre of the bridge which carries the said Coventry Line and Leamington Branch of Midland and Scottish Railway Carthusian Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Carthusian Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Humphrey Burton Road, and extending thence southwestward along the middle of Humphrey Burton Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, from the said Parish of Stivichall."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said

Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Coventry has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.
