"The territory to be dissevered from the said Parish of Chislehurst and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Chislehurst which is bounded upon the southwest and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the northeast, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, from the said Parish of Chislehurst crosses the middle of the said main Sevenoaks Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway north of Chislehurst Station, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley.

## "THE SIXTH SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, and to be annexed to the said Parish of Chislehurst, being :—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint George Bickley, which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the north-east by the said Parish of Chislehurst, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the southwest, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, crosses the Main Sevenoaks Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway south of Chislehurst Station, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Down Chislehurst Loop Line of the same railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, from the said Parish of Chislehurst."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Rochester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of December, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Richmond, of the Parish of Hudswell and of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hipswell, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Richmond and Hudswell are now full, the Reverend Canon Arnold Moon Sullivan being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Richmond, and the Reverend Edgar Edward Hart being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hudswell, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Hipswell, is now vacant:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Ripon appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a Meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 24th day of March, 1938, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other
