WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wortley-de-Leeds, in the County of York, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the City of Leeds in the said County of York, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Leeds.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Wortley-de-Leeds, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burials may be allowed at their decease of the following relations of those already interred therein:—

Isabella Alderson, Samuel Broughton, Minnie Child, Helena Hartley, Jane Hartley, John Lee, Annie Caine Myers, Charles Naylor, Annie Jane Rowe, Margaret Agnes Rowe, Mary Sheard, Benjamin Greaves Whittaker, Edward Wilcox;

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a less depth than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 31st day of January next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 31st day of January.
