Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into and report on the operation and effects of the system of workmen's compensation for injuries due to employment and the working and scope of the law relating thereto, and the relation of this system to other statutory systems for providing benefits or assistance to incapacitated or unemployed workmen and to arrangements for the treatment of injured workmen and the restoration of their working capacity, and to make such recommendations, whether by way of amendment of the Workmen's Compensation Acts or otherwise, as may appear desirable; and, further, to consider in relation to workmen's compensation and advise whether any alteration is desirable in the present position in regard to the civil liability of the employer to pay compensation or damages in respect of such injuries independently of those Acts:
