LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*River Great Ouse Catchment Board.**Glassmoor and Mereside Internal Drainage
District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Local Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the amendment of the Scheme constituting the Glassmoor and Mereside Internal Drainage District, which said Scheme was confirmed by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board (Glassmoor and Mereside Internal Drainage District) Order, 1937, and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-one days from the date of

this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*River Great Ouse Catchment Board.**Bedfordshire First Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Order made on the 1st December, 1938, in relation to the Scheme prepared by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the constitution of the Bedfordshire First Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor, and for certain matters supplemental thereto.

A copy of the Order may be seen at all reasonable hours at the Office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, Elmhurst, Brooklands Avenue, Cambridge, and also at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 10, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.1.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
