“And whereas we consider that the naval ratings so trained should receive an allowance of 1s. 6d. a day when detailed to act as Air Gunner in vacancies in complement:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction payment accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposal.”

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for regulating the Police Courts of the Metropolis," it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to alter the number of the Police Courts, and to order such changes to be made of the places in which they should be holden within the Metropolitan Police District as should be found expedient, and that every such Court should thenceforth be holden in the place in or to which it should be so ordered to be established or removed:

And whereas also, by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her said Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for better defining the powers of Justices within the Metropolitan Police District," it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to constitute within the Metropolitan Police District so many Police Court Divisions as to Her Majesty should seem fit, and to define the extent thereof, and from time to time to alter the number and extent of such Police Court Divisions, and to assign a Division to each of the Police Courts already established, and to establish a Police Court for each of the other Divisions:

And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under the said Acts a Police Court Division has been constituted and assigned to the Police Court called the South Western Police Court, and the extent of such Division altered and defined from time to time:

And whereas it is desirable to make provision for the rebuilding of the said Police Court, and to provide suitable accommodation for the transaction of the business of the said Police Court during such rebuilding, and His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy

Council, has deemed it expedient that, during such rebuilding, the said Police Court should be removed to certain premises known as Daventry House at 217 Balham High Road, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, in the County of London and within the Metropolitan Police District, and that such Police Court should, from and after the date hereinafter mentioned, be holden on the said premises in Balham High Road aforesaid and should be known and called by the name of the South Western Police Court:

His Majesty is pleased, therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that the Police Court now established in Lavender Hill, and known by the name of the South Western Police Court, shall, from and after the thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, be removed therefrom to certain premises known as Daventry House at 217 Balham High Road, in the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth, in the County of London and within the Metropolitan Police District, and shall until His Majesty shall be pleased to order otherwise be there holden by the name of the South Western Police Court, and for the same Division as was assigned to the said South Western Police Court by His Majesty's Order in Council dated the eighteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.

And whereas the Air Navigation Act, 1920, has been amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936:

And whereas the principal Order has from time to time been amended by subsequent Orders (*See* S.R. & O. 1925 (No. 1260) p. 4; 1927 (No. 263) p. 4; 1928 (Nos. 36, 588, 591 and 900) pp. 20-32; 1929 (Nos. 984 and 1001) pp. 59-60; 1930 (No. 334) p. 31; 1931 (Nos. 84, 85 and 419) pp. 19-33; 1932 (Nos. 585 and 851) pp. 67-77; 1933 (No. 743) p. 346; 1934 (Nos. 712, 905 and 1102) I, pp. 123-30; 1935 (No. 513) p. 100; 1936 (No. 571) I, p. 61; 1937 (Nos. 96, 639, 700 and 951) pp. 72-100; and 1938 (Nos. 503 and 1458)):

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas on account of urgency this Order should come into immediate operation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 7 of the principal Order:—

"7.—(1) The Secretary of State may—

(a) prescribe (i) a scale of the fees to be charged at any aerodrome licensed for

public use in respect of any services to aircraft which may be specified in such scale and (ii) conditions to be observed in relation to the charging of such fees or the rendering of such services;

(b) modify from time to time as he may think fit, any scale or conditions so prescribed; and

(c) classify, if he shall think fit, aerodromes so licensed for the purpose of prescribing any such scale or conditions with reference to a particular class of such aerodromes.

(2) The proprietor of any aerodrome so licensed

(a) shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a conspicuous place in the aerodrome a tariff of the charges to be made thereat in respect of services to aircraft; and

(b) shall not make in respect of any service rendered to an aircraft any charge which is greater or less than the charge specified in such tariff in respect of that service, which charge shall in respect of any such service for which a fee is so prescribed as aforesaid be in accordance with the prescribed scale or in a case where no fee is prescribed in respect of such service shall, if the Secretary of State so requires, be a charge approved by him.

(3) The proprietor of any aerodrome which is open to public use by British aircraft on payment of charges, whether or not such aerodrome is licensed for public use, shall allow the aircraft of all countries alike to use the aerodrome to the same extent and upon the same conditions and any charges made at any such aerodrome for landing and length of stay shall be uniformly applicable to the aircraft of all countries alike.

(4) This Article does not apply to Royal Air Force aerodromes or to aerodromes under the control of the Secretary of State."

2. In sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (3) (a) of Article 27 of the principal Order, for the figures "(1)" and "(2)" in the words and figures "paragraphs (1) and (2) of Article 7" there shall be substituted the figures "(2)" and "(3)" respectively.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Provisional) Order, 1939.

(2) This Order shall come into operation forthwith as a Provisional Order in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

(a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is one of the Powers declared by Order in Council to be a party to the said Convention:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. Burma, excluding the Karenni States, is a territory to which the said Convention applies.

2. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 1 Order, 1939, and shall come into force on the 2nd day of February, 1939.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that the legislature of any colony may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, make provision for maintaining and using vessels of war; and that where the legislature of any colony has made provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the colony within its territorial waters, that legislature may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, further make such provision regarding the discipline and service of officers and men of that force as is set out in the Act:

And whereas by the Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council may, on such conditions as He thinks fit, authorise the Admiralty to accept any offer made by the Government of a colony to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy, vessels of war maintained, or officers or men of such force as aforesaid raised by the Colony:

And whereas by the Naval Volunteer Ordinance, 1933, of the Legislature of the Colony of Hong Kong (hereinafter referred to as "the Legislature") provision has been made for raising a force for the Naval Defence of Hong Kong called the Hong Kong Naval Volunteer Force (hereinafter referred to as "the Force"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Hong Kong Naval Defence Order, 1939".

2. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the legislature of the power contained in Section 1 of the Act, to make provision at the expense of the Colony for maintaining and using vessels of war.

3. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Hong Kong to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any vessel of war so maintained, provided that, as regards any such vessel maintained by the Colony of Hong Kong in conjunction with any other Colony, a like offer is made by such last mentioned Colony.

4. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the powers contained in Subsection (i) of Section 2 of the Act, namely, to provide that officers and men of the Force—

(a) shall, whether serving ashore or afloat or within or without the limits of Hong Kong, be subject to all the enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy, with such modifications and adaptations as may be made by the Legislature to adapt those enactments and regulations to the circumstances of Hong Kong;

(b) shall be liable to service and training in any ship, establishment or other place without the limits of Hong Kong, whether belonging to Hong Kong or not;

(c) shall, in the case of officers or men entered on the express terms of accepting general service in the Royal Navy in emergency, form part of the Royal Naval Reserve or of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or that some shall form part of the Royal Naval Reserve and others of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

5. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Hong Kong to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any officers and men of the Force.
