WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39 and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of January, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Bredhurst and the Church and

Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Rainham, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Bredhurst and Rainham is vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Bredhurst and Rainham, now vested in him as such Archbishop should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Rochester for the time being and in token of such his desire and also of his consent to the same transfer which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is in this case made necessary he the said Archbishop has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said Benefices of Bredhurst and Rainham which is hereinbefore mentioned and herein-after recommended and proposed will in our

opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the Parishes of Bredhurst and Rainham:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archbishopial Seal), and with the consent of the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Bredhurst and Rainham now vested in him the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, as such Archbishop as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him the said Archbishop and from his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of January, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Blackburn:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, now Bishop of Blackburn, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £100 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned for effecting improvements at the said Episcopal House of Residence does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Blackburn:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £100, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £100 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid, and that such sum of £100 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of five years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-fifth part of the said principal sum of £100 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £100 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of five years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Blackburn and his successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or

any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Blackburn.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. A gentleman presented for the first time may present only his son on the occasion when he himself is presented.

3. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

5. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services, Burma Services, Indian Army and Burma Army, and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for presentation.

6. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserves of Air Force Officers, Officers of the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, Officers of the Auxiliary Air Force Reserve of Officers, and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Under-Secretary of State, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

7. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Department under which they serve.

8. All Officers of the Indian Services, Burma Services, Indian Army and Burma Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India and Burma Offices, Whitehall.

9. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

10. Gentlemen connected with the Treasury, the Foreign Office, and other Government Departments will make their applications through the Private Secretaries to the Ministers of the respective Departments.

11. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications through the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Home Office.

12. Lord Provosts and Provosts and Conveners of County Councils will make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Scotland, at the Scottish Office, Whitehall.

Scottish Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel and Legal Officials in Scotland should make their applications through the Legal Secretary to the Lord Advocate.

13. Chairmen of County Councils, and gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

14. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

15. The names must be received at the various Offices above indicated as soon as possible, and in any case not later than twelve days prior to the date of the Levée.

5. To make provision as to the consideration for the proposed transfers and to authorise the creation and issue of stock (both consolidated ordinary and preference) of the Company to the East Ardsley Company for distribution amongst the shareholders of that Company.

6. To empower the Company to carry on the said gas undertakings and to confirm or make binding on the parties any agreements for the transfer and vesting thereof and to enact all such incidental and consequential provisions as may be necessary or convenient including provisions for dealing with cases in which meters are read before or after the date of transfer of the undertakings of the Vendors.

7. To make provision for and in respect of the application by the Morley Corporation of the consideration to be received by them upon the transfer of their said undertaking and to provide for the allocation of shares in the capital of the Company to shareholders of the East Ardsley Company and the dissolution of that Company.

8. To make provision as to the compensation to be paid to officers and servants of the Vendors.

9. To repeal, alter or amend all or some of the provisions of the Morley Corporation (Gas &c.) Act 1898, the Morley Corporation Act 1913, the Morley Gas (Charges) Order 1923, the East Ardsley Gas Act 1903 and the East Ardsley Gas (Charges) Order 1929 and any other Act or Order relating to the Vendors or their gas undertakings and to render applicable to the Company with or without alteration such of those provisions as are not so repealed.

10. To extend the limits within which the Company are authorised to supply gas so as to include the following areas (hereinafter referred to as "the added limits"):

In the West Riding of the County of York:

(a) the Borough of Morley excepting the part thereof which prior to the coming into operation of the County of York West Riding Review Order 1937 was comprised within the existing limits and constituted the Urban Districts of Gildersome and Drighlington;



(b) that part of the Urban District of Stanley containing in the whole 35 acres or thereabouts which prior to the coming into operation of the County of York West Riding Review Order 1937 constituted part of the Urban District of Ardsley East and West;

and to provide that the Company shall have and may exercise within the added limits all powers, rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply.

11. To authorise the Company to continue, maintain and use any mains, pipes and other works transferred to or vested in them under the Order or belonging to them within the added limits and to apply to such mains, pipes and works the provisions of the Order and of the Acts incorporated therewith and of the Drighlington and Gildersome Gas Act 1865 and the Drighlington and Gildersome Gas (Charges) Order 1922.

12. To make provision as to the calorific value of the gas to be supplied in the added limits.

13. To authorise the Company to hold and use for the purposes of their undertaking the lands in the borough of Morley and belonging to the Morley Corporation and the East Ardsley Company which are authorised to be used by that Company and Corporation for gasworks, and on the said lands to maintain, alter, improve, extend, renew, and use or discontinue the existing gas works and other works and to erect, maintain, alter and use or discontinue new or additional gasworks, machinery, and other apparatus, and to store gas and convert and manufacture the residual products of gas.

14. To empower the Company to purchase by agreement and to hold and use additional lands for the purposes of their undertaking and to confer further powers upon the Company with respect to the disposal and letting of any lands vested in or acquired by them and the purchase or taking on lease of houses, &c. for employees, offices, showrooms and other buildings and the erection and fitting up of such buildings.

15. To authorise the Company to provide recreation grounds for their employees.

16. To preserve for exercise by the Company the unexercised powers of the East Ardsley Company in regard to the raising of capital and to empower the Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of further amounts of consolidated ordinary stock or preference stock or wholly or partly by one or more of those modes respectively.

17. For the several purposes hereinbefore referred to, to provide for the increase of the nominal capital of the Company.

18. To make provision as to the sale of share capital of the Company by auction or tender and also as to the issue of such capital for the benefit of small investors and to empower the Company with the consent of the Board of Trade to offer share capital for subscription by consumers of gas and employees of the Company without first offering the same for sale by public auction or tender.

19. To increase the amount of money which the Company may borrow on mortgage or raise by the creation and issue of debenture stock in respect of their existing capital and to empower the Company to raise additional money

by borrowing on mortgage and by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by either of such means.

20. To fix a basic price for the gas to be supplied by the Company and to make provision for the revision of such basic price; to require the actual prices charged by the Company to be agreed with the Morley Corporation from time to time or settled by arbitration.

21. To prescribe a basic rate of dividend on the consolidated ordinary stock of the Company, to empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply their profits in payment of dividends in excess of the basic rate and for the benefit of the Company's employees and otherwise, and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount (if any) of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

22. To limit the dividend which may be paid on preference capital and to make provision in regard to the formation by the Company of a reserve fund, a special purposes fund and a renewal fund, and to provide for the application of any moneys standing to the credit of the existing reserve fund of the Company.

23. To empower the Company to purchase and cancel their debentures or debenture stock and to make provision as to the minimum holdings of ordinary and preference stock and debenture stock of the Company.

24. To make further provision with reference to the Company's affairs, including provisions as to:—

The number and quorum of directors, appointment of a managing director, the appointment of a Director of the Company by the Morley Corporation, directors holding office under or contracting with the Company, the circumstances in which the office of director shall be vacated, and the notice of candidature of or of opposition to re-election of directors; the exercise of borrowing powers by the Directors without the sanction of a meeting; the appointment of proxies, voting rights in case of joint holders; register of shareholders and shareholders' address book and the substitution of card index therefor; the closing of transfer books, the signing of minutes, the determination of the remuneration of the Secretary of the Company by the Directors, the election of auditors, the holding of ordinary meetings of the Company, the giving of notices of meetings, the quorum at general meetings; the number of stockholders required to convene meetings; voting rights; receipts in case of minors; receipt of treasurer secretary or managing director to be valid discharges; relief to the Company to see to the execution of trusts and indemnity before issue of substituted certificate.

25. To make provision as to the payment of half-yearly dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting.

26.
