TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd March, 1939, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th March, 1939, to Saturday, the 11th March, 1939, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent, (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the

House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Board of Trade hereby give notice that, in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, they have granted three Prospecting Licences to the D'Arcy Exploration Company, Limited, of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, in respect of the areas contained in the First Schedule hereto, and one Prospecting Licence to the Anglo-American Oil Company, Limited, of 36, Queen Anne's Gate, London, S.W.1, in respect of the area contained in the Second Schedule hereto. The boundaries of the areas are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the six-inch Ordnance Survey Map.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An Area of approximately 197 square miles situated in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the point where the London Midland and Scottish Railway crosses the road at Birkdale Railway Station. Thence along the railway in a general north-easterly direction passing through Crossens and Hesketh Bank Railway Stations to Hoole Railway Station. Thence in a east-south-easterly direction along the road for about 2,000 feet to the road junction, and thence along the roads in a southerly and south-westerly direction passing west of Much Hoole and past Mill Hill to the road junction at Carr House. Thence in a general south-easterly direction along the road past Bretherton, Croston Railway Station and Barber's Moor to the road junction about 2,000 feet east of the Inn at Newtown.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a general southerly direction along the road past Ecclestone, Heskin Green, Hunger Hill, Shevington Vale, Shevington, Gathurst and Far Moor to the cross-roads at point 409. Thence in a south-westerly direction along the road past Billinge and Moss Bank to the road junction about 1,800 feet south of Moss Bank Railway Station.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a general south-westerly direction along the road past Denton's Green and Spring Field to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-west of Spring Field. Thence in a northerly direction to the road junction about 1,100 feet north of Catchdale Moss. Thence in a westerly direction to the road junction at Moss Side and in a south-westerly direction to Knowsley. Thence in a west-north-westerly direction past the School for a distance of about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the cross-roads, and thence along the road in a south-south-westerly direction past Radshaw Nook to its junction with the drive from Croxteth Hall. Thence in a west-north-westerly direction to the road junction south of the School and in a southerly direction for a distance of about 1,700 feet to the road junction at point 68. Thence in a general north-westerly direction along the road past Copple House, Aintree, Netherton and Thornton to Little Crosby Church. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction past Hall Road Railway Station to a point on the coast at high water mark about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of Hall Road Railway Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the coast at high water mark in a general northerly direction past Formby Point to a point west of the road from Ainsdale at Ainsdale-on-Sea. Thence eastwards to the road and thence in an east-south-easterly direction to Ainsdale Railway Station. Thence through Ainsdale by way of Station Road and in a north-north-easterly direction along the main road to the point where the London Midland & Scottish Railway crosses the road at Birkdale Railway Station, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 46 square miles situated in the Counties of Derby, Leicester and Stafford.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the cross-roads by the Church in the village of Etwall situated in the County of Derby about $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-west of Derby. Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past The Grange, and through Mickleover to the road junction about 1,100 feet north-east of Huffin Heath. Thence along the road in a general south-easterly direction to Littleover and passing through the village by way of New Road and continuing in a south-south-easterly direction along the road past Oaklands to the road junction about 2,000 feet west of Cottons Farm.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a southerly direction along the road to Sinfin and in a south-westerly direction to Sinfin House and continuing in a south-south-easterly direction crossing the Trent and Mersey Canal and eastwards to the road junction at Swarkestone. Thence in a south-easterly direction past Stanton by Bridge to Melbourne and continuing in a general southerly direction past Woodhouses, Hilltop House in the County of Leicester, and Lount Wood to the road junction about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile west of Coleorton Hall.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a west-south-westerly direction along the road to the Cemetery in the town of

Ashby de la Zouch. Thence in a general north-westerly direction along the road past Ann Well Place in the County of Derby, through Woodville, past Midway and Stanhope Bretby, to the road junction at Moat Bank in the County of Stafford.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past Broken Flats in the County of Derby, to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile past Broken Flats. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the road through Repton past Willington Railway Station and over Etwall Common to the cross-roads by the Church in Etwall, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 143 square miles situated in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at a point on the Keys Beck Road about 300 feet south of the ford at point 547 over Rutmoor Beck and about 3,800 feet north-west of Brown Head and about 8 miles north of Pickering, thence in a straight line in an easterly direction for about 13 miles to a point on the coast at high water mark about 1,500 feet north-east of Hayburn Wyke Railway Station.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the coast at high water mark in a general south-easterly direction past Scarborough and Filey Brigg to a point about 250 feet south of the Coastguard Station at the town of Filey.

Southern Boundary.

Thence through the town by way of Black Cliff Head, Mitford Street and Scarborough Road and along the main road in a north-westerly direction through Leberston, Cayton and past Seamer to West Ayton. Thence continuing in a south-westerly direction past Wykeham and Brompton and in a westerly direction through Snainton to the cross-roads by Eberston Railway Station. Thence in a northerly direction to the road junction by the Inn at Allerston, and thence in a westerly direction through Thornton Dale to the junction of Potter Hill and Middleton Road in the town of Pickering.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a north-westerly direction along the road through Middleton to the road junction by the Inn at Wrelton. Thence in a general northerly direction along the road past Eastfield House, Cropton and Blackpark Lodge to a point about 1,850 feet north of Blackpark Lodge. Thence in a straight line in an easterly direction for about 3 miles to a point on the Newton-Stape road about 1,000 feet south of Rawcliff. Thence in a northerly direction along the road past Rawcliff and Stape to a point on the Keys Beck Road about 300 feet south of the ford over Rutmoor Beck, the point of departure.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An Area of approximately 149 square miles situated in the Counties of Fife and Kinross.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the road junction $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south-west of Meadowhead about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles

north-north-east of Saline in the County of Fife. Thence in a general east-north-easterly direction along the road past Bogside in the County of Kinross to Cleish, and thence in a general east-south-easterly direction past Sunnyside and Binn, and in a north-easterly direction past Ballingry in the County of Fife, West Mains in the County of Kinross, Balbedie in the County of Fife, and Auchmuirbridge, and through the town of Leslie by way of the main road to the road junction by Eglantine Square.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the road in a south-south-easterly direction past Woodside, Thornton and Gallatown to the road junction about 600 feet south-west of Dysart Railway Station. Thence in a north-easterly direction for about 100 feet to the road junction, thence in a south-easterly direction to a point on the coast at high water mark about 200 feet north of Lady Blanche Coal Pit at Dysart.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a general south-westerly direction along the coast at high water mark past Kirkcaldy, Burntisland and Inverkeithing Bay to the Forth Bridge. Thence along the main road in a north-westerly direction to the road junction about 900 feet west of Jamestown and in a general west-south-westerly direction along the coast road past Brucehaven and through Limekilns to the railway terminus at Charles-town. Thence along the railway in a westerly and north-westerly direction to the point where it crosses a stream about 1,300 feet north-west of Braeside. Thence along the coast at high water mark in a westerly and north-westerly direction to the point where the railway runs along the coast west of Torryburn. Thence along the railway in a westerly direction to the road from New Mills.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a northerly direction along the road past New Mills to Over Inzievar and in an easterly direction to the road junction south of Oakley Railway Station. Thence in a northerly direction past Oakley and in a westerly direction to Comrie. Thence in a general northerly direction through Saline, past Balgonar and Hill End to the road junction $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-west of Meadowhead, the point of departure.
