WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation bearing date the 26th day of January, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before

Your Majesty in Council the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the Parish of Lindfield, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the said Parish of Lindfield should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, as Diocesan, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation) and with the consent of the Church Association Trust, Incorporated, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Lindfield (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and of the said Parish of Lindfield, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath'.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Richard, Haywards Heath, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Cuckfield, upon the north by the Parish of Ardingly, upon the north-east and upon the east by the Parish of Lindfield, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Lindfield from the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, crosses the middle of America Lane, and extending thence first north-westward and then westward along the middle of America Lane for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to

a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which leads through Bent's Wood into Oathall Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Oathall Road, and extending thence first westward to and then south-westward along the middle of Oathall Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath which leads across The Heath Recreation Ground into Perrymount Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Perrymount Road opposite to the eastern end of Station Road, and extending thence westward to and along the middle of Station Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof (thereby crossing the main line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway) for a distance in all of 9½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road called Market Place, and extending thence southward along the middle of Market Place for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Paddockhall Road, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Paddockhall Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lucastes Avenue, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Lucastes Avenue for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence generally south-westward to and along the said fence and along the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 2 upon the said map or plan for a distance in all of 28 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, from the said Parish of Cuckfield.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Lindfield which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield, from the said Parish of Lindfield at the centre of the bridge which carries Bordehill Lane across the said main line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bordehill Lane and along the middle of the footpath leading into Portsmouth Lane for a distance in all of 33 chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath reaches the western side of Portsmouth Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Portsmouth Lane for a distance in all of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Gander Hill upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Lindfield from the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Cuckfield."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis severed from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be dis severed from the New Parish of Saint Peter, Aldborough Hatch, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing

date the 5th day of February, 1862, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Emmanuel Church, situate at Sidlow Bridge, in the Parish of Horley, in the said County of Surrey and at that time in the said Diocese of Winchester, but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 21st day of December, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, situate at South Park in the said Parish of Reigate, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate':

"And whereas the said Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 10th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, and the said New Parish of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, and the said New Parish of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Leigh, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north partly by the Parish of Reigate in the said County and Diocese, partly by the said New Parish of Saint Luke, South Park, Reigate, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Redhill, from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, at the junction of Price's Lane and Dovers Green Road, and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of Dovers Green Road for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway forming the main drive to the house and premises known as Hartswood Manor, and extending thence westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 28½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway forming the north drive to Hartswood Manor, and extending thence first north-westward, then westward and then northward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the stream which flows past the northern side of Hartswood Manor into the River Mole, and extending thence south-westward to and along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the River Mole, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the middle of the River Mole for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, from the said Parish of Leigh.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation

and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned signified their assent thereto:

And whereas three of the Patrons of the said Rectory of the New Parish of Emmanuel, Sidlow Bridge, have offered certain objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of March, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (some-time Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, partly out of the New Parish (some-time Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, and partly out of the Parish of West Acklam, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, and the said Parish of West Acklam are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, and of the said Parish of West Acklam, which are hereinafter

mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship :

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors :

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111 :

“ And whereas a capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid towards the cost of the erection of a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District :

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Archbishop of York for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, and of the said Parish of West Acklam, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Martin, Middlesbrough.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Martin, Middlesbrough, being :—

“ All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, and of the Parish of West Acklam, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which taken together are bounded upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Thornaby on Tees, and partly by the Parish of Stainton, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east, upon the north and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point at the south side of Fleet Bridge where the boundaries of the said Parish of Stainton, of the said Parish of West Acklam, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, all meet, and extending thence eastward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Acklam from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the point where it diverges northward from following the southern side of Mandale Road, and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of Mandale Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Levick Crescent, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Levick Crescent for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Croft Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Croft Avenue for a distance of 22½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with The Green Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of The Green Lane for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Reeth Road and extending thence northward along the middle of Reeth Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Acklam from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe) for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Appleton Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Appleton Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cambridge Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Cambridge Road for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thornfield Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Thornfield Road for a distance of 28½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Acklam Road North, and extending thence westward along the middle of Acklam Road North for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with West Lane (upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, from the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough) and extending thence northward along the middle of West Lane (thereby following the

last-mentioned boundary) for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Northern Road, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Northern Road for a distance of $21\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with a proposed new road leading to Eckert Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of such proposed new road for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eckert Avenue, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Eckert Avenue (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Middlesbrough, from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe) and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance of $27\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of The Old River upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Linthorpe, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Thornaby on Tees."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception hereinafter mentioned, signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the said Vicarage of the Parish of West Acklam has not signified his assent or offered any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since the date of the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

Whereas by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any Scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the Scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by subsection (4) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1939, which provides that the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for the matters specified in the Schedule to the said Order in addition to the matters mentioned in subsections (2) and (3) of the said Section 3;

And whereas it is provided by Clause 18 of the said Scheme (*inter alia*) that any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme shall be operative from such date as may be prescribed by the Board of Trade;

And whereas in pursuance of the said Clause 18 the amendments of the said Scheme set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive

Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme;

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (5) of Section 1 of the said Act hereby approve the amendments of the Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, set out in the Schedule hereto and prescribe the 10th day of March, 1939, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Cumberland District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. At the end of Clause 35A there shall be inserted the following Clauses:—

" 35B (1). When two or more owners are so associated that the same person or persons exercise effective control over both or all of them, as the case may be, they may, by notice in writing to the Board, claim that their coal mines shall be treated as one coal mine for the purpose of determination of annual output and export supply standard tonnages, annual basic tonnages, annual tonnages of coal which may be supplied for consumption in excluded works (all of which tonnages are in this and the next following Clause of this Scheme included in the term "annual tonnages"); quarterly proportions of such annual tonnages, quotas and trade shares.

(2) If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the owners claiming as aforesaid are so associated, the Board shall declare them to be associated owners and on making such declaration the Board shall forthwith determine the annual tonnages of the coal mines of the associated owners as if they were one coal mine by adding together the respective annual tonnages of those coal mines, subject however to any adjustment that may be requisite having regard in respect of the output standard tonnage to the special circumstances of the coal mines and in respect of the export supply standard tonnage to any matters relevant to such determination.

(3) The coal mines of associated owners shall after such declaration and determination be treated as one coal mine for the purpose of the determination and revision of annual tonnages, the quarterly proportions thereof, quotas and trade shares.

35C. If at any time it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board that associated owners have ceased to be associated in the manner referred to in sub-clause (1) of Clause 35B, the Board shall so declare, and shall also declare at the same time, if it is proved to their satisfaction, that two or more of such formerly associated owners are associated in that manner, and on making such

declaration the Board shall forthwith determine the annual tonnages of the coal mine of each owner who is no longer an associated owner and of the coal mines of any owners declared to be associated by dividing among them in such proportions as may be fair and equitable the annual tonnages of the coal mines of which they were formerly associated owners, subject however to any adjustment that may be necessary having regard in respect of any output standard tonnage to the special circumstances of the coal mine and in respect of any export supply standard tonnage to any matters relevant to such determination."

2. Clause 37 shall have effect as if for sub-clause (5) there were substituted the following sub-clauses:—

" (5) Associated owners to whom any sum is due under the provisions of this Clause shall notify the Sales Committee of the name of the person to whom payment is to be made, being a person who is able to give to the Board a valid discharge for any such payment.

(6) Associated owners shall be jointly and severally liable to pay any sum due from them to the Board under the provisions of this Clause."

3. At the end of Clause 55 there shall be inserted the following sub-clause:—

" (3) Associated owners shall be jointly and severally liable to pay to the Board any penalty demanded by the Board under this Clause."

THE PUBLIC ASSISTANCE (CASUAL POOR) AMENDMENT ORDER, 1939, DATED MARCH 8, 1939, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HEALTH UNDER THE POOR LAW ACT, 1930 (20 & 21 GEO. 5. C. 17) FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC ASSISTANCE (CASUAL POOR) ORDER, 1931.

Whereas by the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Order, 1931 (S.R. & O. 1931 No. 136)

(in this order referred to as "the order of 1931") made by the Minister of Health under the Poor Law Act, 1930, regulations are prescribed in regard to the administration of the relief of the casual poor;

And whereas it is expedient that the order of 1931 should be amended as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, the Minister of Health, in exercise of his powers under the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

General.

1. This order may be cited as the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Amendment Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1939.

2. The order of 1931 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) The following provision shall be added as a proviso to paragraph 1 of the First Schedule:—

Provided that the dinner served to inmates of an institution of which the casual ward forms part may, if comprising meat or fish, be served in place of that prescribed;

(b) The Dietary Table set out in Part I of the Schedule to this order shall be substituted for the Dietary Table set out in paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the order of 1931;

(c) The Dietary Table set out in Part II of the Schedule to this order shall be substituted for the Dietary Table set out in paragraph 7 of the First Schedule to the order of 1931.
