PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Uganda Order in Council, 1902 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1902") as amended and supplemented by the Uganda Order in Council, 1911, the Uganda Order in Council, 1912, the Uganda Order in Council, 1920 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1920"), and the Uganda Order in Council, 1926, provision is made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in the Protectorate of Uganda (in this Order referred to as "the Protectorate"):

And whereas it is desirable to amend certain provisions of the Order of 1902 and of the Order of 1920 in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Short titles.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Uganda Order in Council, 1939", and the Orders hereinbefore mentioned and this Order may be cited together as "The Uganda Orders in Council, 1902 to 1939".

Amendment of Article 1 of Order of 1902.

2. Article 1 of the Order of 1902 is hereby revoked (without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder), and the following article shall be substituted therefor:—

" 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as 'The Uganda Order in Council, 1902.'

(2) The limits of this Order are the territories constituting the Uganda Protectorate (in this Order referred to as 'Uganda' or 'the Protectorate') bounded by the Colony of Kenya, the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, the Belgian Congo, and the Mandated Territories of Ruanda-Urundi and Tanganyika.

(3) If His Majesty is pleased to direct that any territories, within which His Majesty has for the time being power and jurisdiction, shall form part of the Protectorate, those territories shall, as from a date to be fixed by order of the Secretary of State, be deemed to be within the limits of this Order. In like manner, if His Majesty is pleased to direct that any territories for the time being forming part of the Protectorate shall cease to form part thereof, those territories shall as from a date to be fixed by order of the Secretary of State, cease to be within the limits of this Order."

Amendment of Article 6 (1) of Order of 1902.

3. Paragraph (1) of Article 6 of the Order of 1902 is hereby revoked (without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder) and the

following paragraph shall be substituted therefor:—

“(1) The Governor may, by proclamation:—

(a) with the approval of the Secretary of State, define any boundaries of the territories for the time being within the limits of this Order, and

(b) divide those territories into provinces or districts in such manner and with such sub-divisions as may be convenient for the purposes of administration, describing the boundaries thereof and assigning names thereto.”

Amendment of Article 15 of Order of 1902.

4. Article 15 of the Order of 1902 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the insertion of the two following paragraphs immediately after paragraph (2) thereof.

“(2A) There shall be as many judges of the High Court as may from time to time be required and the principal judge shall be designated the Chief Justice. The High Court shall be fully constituted by any one of the judges thereof, but in any particular case or matter the Chief Justice or, in his absence, the next senior judge may direct that the Court shall be constituted by two or more judges.

(2B) No person shall be appointed to be a judge of the High Court unless:—

(i) He is qualified to practise as an advocate in a Court in England, Scotland, Northern Ireland or some other part of His Majesty's dominions having unlimited jurisdiction either in civil or criminal matters, and

(ii) he has been qualified for not less than five years to practise as an advocate or solicitor in such a court.

(2C) In any case of death, illness, absence, pressure of business, or in any other emergency, one or more acting judges of the High Court may be appointed.”

(b) by the revocation of paragraph (3) thereof and the substitution thereof of the following paragraph:—

“(3) Subject to the provisions of any Ordinance or rules, the Chief Justice shall make such arrangements as he thinks fit for the distribution of the business of the High Court, and the Court may sit at any place in the Protectorate that may be convenient.”

(c) by the addition at the end thereof of the following paragraph:—

“(5) There shall be such Registrars, taxing masters, bailiffs and other officials of the High Court as may be necessary, who shall have such powers and duties as may be vested in them by any Ordinance or rules of court or as may be assigned to them by any directions issued by the Chief Justice.”

Insertion of Article 23A in Order of 1902.

5. The following Article shall be inserted in the Order of 1902 immediately after Article 23 thereof:—

“23A. No judge, magistrate or other person acting judicially shall be liable to be sued in any civil court for any act done or ordered to be done by him in the discharge

of his judicial duty whether or not within the limits of his jurisdiction, if he, at the time, in good faith believed himself to have jurisdiction to do or order the act complained of; and no officer of any court or other person bound to execute the lawful orders or warrants of any such judge, magistrate or other person acting judicially shall be liable to be sued in any civil court in respect of any act done in execution of any order or warrant which he would be bound to execute if within the jurisdiction of the person issuing the same.”

Amendment of Article XVI of Order of 1920.

6. Article XVI of the Order of 1920 is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Article is substituted therefor:—

“Dismissal and suspension of officers.”

“XVI. The Governor may, subject to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him by His Majesty through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss or suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any public office within the Protectorate, or subject as aforesaid, may take such other disciplinary action as may seem to him desirable.”

Saving for existing boundaries etc.

7. Until other provision is made by Proclamation under Article 6 of the Uganda Order in Council, 1902, as amended by this Order, the boundaries, divisions, sub-divisions and names as defined, described and assigned under the said Article prior to the date upon which this Order comes into operation shall continue to have effect.

Power to revoke, etc.

8. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation in the Official Gazette of the Protectorate and shall be published in the said Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1845, and published in the London Gazette on the 21st day of October, 1845, part of the Chapelry of Attercliffe, in the Parish of Sheffield, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of York but now in the said Diocese of Sheffield, was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and the said District was named ‘ The District of Pitsmoor ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of May, 1895, and published in the London Gazette of the 17th day of the same month, portions of the New Parish of Wadsley and of the Parish of Ecclesfield, both in the said County of York and at that time in the said Diocese of York but now in the said Diocese of Sheffield, were constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and the said District was named ‘ The District of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1910, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Grenoside, situate in the said Parish of Ecclesfield, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Grenoside ’:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Pitsmoor, the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge, and the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and

after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Pitsmoor, the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge and the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Ecclesfield, of the said New Parish of Pitsmoor, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dis severed from such Parish and New Parishes respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, comprising:—

“ I. All those contiguous isolated portions of the Parish of Ecclesfield and of the New Parish of Pitsmoor, both in the said County and Diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the north-west and upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge, upon the south-east by the District of Saint Leonard, Norwood, Sheffield, upon the east and upon the north-east by the District of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, and upon the remaining part of the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, all in the said County and Diocese.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge, upon the south by the above described isolated portion of the Parish of Ecclesfield, upon the east by the said District of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, at the junction of Halifax Road with Chaucer Road and a road leading to Fox Hill Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said road leading to Fox Hill Road for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, from the said New Parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures

affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.
