At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of April, 1939.

BY THE LORDS OF HIS MAJESTY'S MOST HONOURABLE PRIVY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS on 21st August, 1936, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations communicated to His Majesty's Government a certified copy of a draft Convention (No. 50) concerning the regulation of certain special systems of recruiting workers, which had been adopted by the International Labour Conference at Geneva on 20th June, 1936:

And whereas it is provided in Article 19 of the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation that in the case of a draft Convention so communicated each Member of the International Labour Organisation shall, if such draft Convention obtains the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies, communicate the formal ratification thereof to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations:

And whereas the said draft Convention has in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland obtained the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies and such action as is necessary to make the provisions of the said draft Convention effective therein has been taken:

And whereas by virtue of Article 25 of the said draft Convention there is appended hereto a Declaration in accordance with which the said draft Convention is to apply to British Colonies, British Protectorates and Protected States, and Mandated Territories administered under the

authority of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as set out in the said Declaration:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be confirmed and approved.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932. Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorities.

#### (HERBERT CECIL DUCKWORTH.)

Whereas in pursuance of the power conferred upon the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, the Authorities granted by the aforesaid Regulations to duly qualified medical practi-tioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, were, by Notice dated the 10th April, 1935, and published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 12th April, 1935, withdrawn from Herbert Cecil Duckworth, L.A.H. (Dublin), then residing at 52, Wonford Road, Exeter, who had been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas at the same time a direction was given by the Secretary of State that it should not be lawful for the said Herbert Cecil

Duckworth to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928:

### MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

# Civil Service Commission, April 14, 1939.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:-

REGULATIONS RESPECTING A SPECIAL LIMITED COMPETITION FOR THE SITUATIONS OF TYPIST AND CLERK-TYPIST (FEMALE) IN DEPART-MENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Candidates must have completed six months' continuous service in a British Government Department immediately prior to the last day for the receipt of applications for the competition in one or more of the following capacities, viz.:—Temporary Typist; Temporary Clerk-Typist; Temporary Shorthand Typist; Temporary Clerk-Shorthand Typist.

A candidate who has completed six months' continuous service in a British Government Department in one or more of the above capacities terminating on a date between the 26th January, 1939, and the last day for the receipt of applications will not be regarded as ineligible, provided she is re-employed in one of those capacities in the same Department after a break not exceeding one month and continues to be so employed up to the last day for the receipt of applications.
2. No candidate will be eligible for admission

to the examination whose age on the last day for the receipt of applications exceeds 50 years.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners-

(a) That they are unmarried or widows.(b) That they are duly qualified in respect

of health and character.

4. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject,

- and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.
- 5. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:-

(I) English. (2) Arithmetic.

(3) Either French or Geography.

No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in English and in the aggregate of the marks for the whole examination.

7. Application for permission to attend the Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners; the application must be accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the Department in which the candidate is serving, in the space provided on the application form, that she satisfies the conditions laid down in Clause 1 of these regulations, that she is competent to perform the duties of an established Typist or Clerk-Typist, and that in the event of her success the Department is prepared to accept her as an established member of the Typing grades.

8. A fee of ten shillings will be required from every candidate applying for admission to

attend the Examination.

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# CITY AND COUNTY OF KINGSTON-UPON-HULL.

APPOINTMENT OF ADJUDICATING OFFICERS.

100,895. (11th April, 1939.)

Whereas it is expedient that the Council of the City and County of Kingston-upon-Hull (which Council and City and County are in this Order referred to as "the Council" and "the City" respectively) should be empowered to appoint Officers to be termed Adjudicating Officers to perform duties under the Poor Law Acts, 1930 to 1938, relating to the grant of relief:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

## Citation, &c.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Kingston-upon-Hull (Adjudicating Officers)

Order, 1939, and, in its application to the City, shall be read as one with the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as modified by this Order:

Provided that in case of any inconsistency the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1939.

# Modification of Orders, &c., applicable to the City.

- 2.—(1) Any orders rules or regulations made by the Minister and in force in the City shall, in their application to the City, have effect subject to such modifications as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions of this Order.
- (2) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Public Assistance Order, 1930, in its application to the City shall be modified in manner following, namely:—
  - (a) in paragraph (I) (b) of Article 25, before the words "a Relieving Officer," there shall be inserted the words "an Adjudicating Officer or";
  - (b) in paragraph (5) of Article 166, after the words "the Council," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer," and after the words "when required by them," there shall be inserted the words "or him";
  - (c) to paragraph (1) of Article 167, there shall be added the words "and shall also attend before any Adjudicating Officer when that Officer is considering applications for relief reported to him by the Receiving Officer";
  - (d) in paragraph (4) of Article 167, after the word "Committee," there shall be inserted the words "and each attendance before any Adjudicating Officer";
  - (e) in paragraph (5) of Article 167, for the words "report to the Committee at their next meeting every application for relief made to him since their previous meeting," there shall be substituted the words "report to the Adjudicating Officer acting for his district every application for relief made to him ";
  - (f) in paragraph (12) of Article 167, for the words "until the next ordinary meeting of the Committee," there shall be substituted the words "until his next attendance before an Adjudicating Officer."
- (3) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Relief Regulation Order, 1930 (as amended by the Relief Regulation Amendment Order, 1932) in its application to the City shall be modified in manner following, namely:—
  - (a) in the proviso to paragraph (2) (a) of Article 11, for the word "Committee" wherever that word occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Sub-Committee or Adjudicating Officer," and the word "their" in line 7 shall be omitted;
  - (b) in Article 10, the proviso to Article 12 and Article 16, after the words "Committee or Sub-Committee," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or Adjudicating Officer."

# Appointment of Officers.

3. The Council shall from time to time appoint such numbers of suitable persons as they may think necessary to hold the office of Adjudicating Officer to perform such of the duties of that office (as prescribed by this Order) in such area or areas as the Council may from time to time require.

# Conditions of Service, &c.

4. Every person appointed by the Council as an Adjudicating Officer shall be a Senior Poor Law Officer.

# Duties of Adjudicating Officers.

- 5. The duties of Adjudicating Officers shall be the following, namely:—
- (a) to consider all applications for relief reported to them by Relieving Officers and Relieving Officers' Reports thereon, and, when necessary, to interview applicants for relief;
  - (b) to determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with rules prescribed by the Council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief;
- (c) to make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;
- (d) to reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf and, subject thereto, in accordance with any rules prescribed by the Council in that behalf, the cases of persons receiving relief, and to make any necessary orders with regard thereto;
- (e) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee
   all orders for relief made by them;
- (f) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee such applications for relief reported to them by Relieving Officers and such cases due for reconsideration by them as in their opinion should be dealt with by such Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;
  - (g) to refer to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee for review or consideration any case in which an applicant for relief or a recipient of relief asks for reconsideration of an Adjudicating Officers' determination or proposed determination of his case;
  - (h) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued, stating the reasons for the action taken.
