PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Recites Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922, and Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1935.

WHEREAS by the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) as amended by the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1935, provision is made for the administration of the Government of the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Short Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1939, and the Principal Order, the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1935, and this Order may be cited together as the Nigeria Protectorate Orders in Council, 1922 to 1939.

Inserts fresh Clause V.

II. The Principal Order shall have effect as if the following Clause were inserted therein immediately after Clause IV:—

Division of Protectorate.

"V. The Protectorate of Nigeria shall be divided into two portions, which shall be known as the Northern Provinces and the Southern Provinces respectively; and it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation issued with His Majesty's approval, signified through the Secretary of State, to define, and from time to time to vary, the boundaries thereof."

Amends Clause IX of Principal Order.

III. The proviso forming the second paragraph of Clause IX of the Principal Order is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

Commencement.

IV. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, and shall be published in the said Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate of Nigeria.

V. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

THE PLACES OF ELECTION (SCOTLAND) ORDER, 1939, DATED APRIL 12, 1939, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 43 (16) OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918 (7 & 8 GEO. 5, c. 64), SUBSTITUTING NEW PLACE OF ELECTION FOR THE PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCY OF BUTE AND NORTHERN DIVISION OF THE PARLIAMENTARY COUNTY OF AYR AND BUTE.

Whereas by sub-section (16) of Section 43 of the above Act it is provided that, in the case of parliamentary elections (other than an election for a university constituency) the place of election shall be a convenient room situated in such place as the Secretary for Scotland may by order from time to time determine:

And whereas in pursuance of this provision places of election were determined by the Places of Election (Scotland) Order, 1918*:

And whereas certain amendments in the provisions of that Order were made by the Places of Election (Scotland) Orders, 1922,† 1923‡ and 1929§:

And whereas a further amendment in the provisions of the Places of Election (Scotland)

Order, 1918, appears to me expedient:
Now therefore, I, the Right Honourable John Colville, T.D., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby order, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the provision above recited as read with the Secretaries of State Act, 1926, that the Schedule to the Places of Election (Scotland) Order, 1918, shall be further amended by the substitution in Part II of Ayr for Kilwinning as the Place of Election for the Bute and Northern Division of Ayr and Bute.

This Order may be cited as the Places of Election (Scotland) Order, 1939.
