Colville, T.D., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby order, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the provision above recited as read with the Secretaries of State Act, 1926, || that the Schedule to the Places of Election (Scotland) Order, 1918, shall be further amended by the substitution in Part II of Ayr for Kilwinning as the Place of Election for the Bute and Northern Division of Ayr and Bute.

This Order may be cited as the Places of Election (Scotland) Order, 1939.
