The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new Westminster Hospital on 20th instant:—

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY:
May it Please Your Majesty,

As President and on behalf of the Governors of Westminster Hospital and of all who have taken part in its welfare and growth, I express to your Majesties our sense of loyalty and devotion, and humbly and dutifully offer our gratitude for the honour bestowed on the Hospital. Your gracious presence here to-day is not only the highest tribute possible to the personal labour and liberality that have raised this noble building, but also another of those inestimable services to the voluntary institutions of this country and to the alleviation of suffering, with which your Majesties have always been identified.

We proudly claim that, among the great Voluntary Hospitals of the country, the Westminster has always been in the forefront of medical progress—the first in the great hospital building movement of the eighteenth century, and now the last word in hospital development.

It was founded in 1719 in a small building in Petty France. The Founders at that time, in declaring the objects of the charity, recorded "that our principal care be confined to the sick and needy persons of St. Margaret's, Westminster, until it shall please God that our stock increases." Our stock has indeed increased.

During the 220 years which have elapsed since the foundation of the Hospital, its history has been one of uninterrupted evolution, alike in its wards, in its laboratories, in the science of medicine and surgery, and in its Medical School.

Throughout its life there has been an ever-growing demand for the services of the Hospital, and for greater and more modern facilities. Until now, these have had to be met to the best of our ability by housing the Nurses apart from the Main Hospital, by the relegation of our cancer service to a building at Hampstead, and by removing the Medical School to Caxton Street, a separation that was both uneconomic and inefficient, as well as inconvenient, not only to the Nurses and Students, but also to the patients, many of whom had to go daily for their treatment from one place to another.

In June 1935 the foundation stone of the new Hospital was laid. During the four years that have elapsed, our beautiful home for Nurses has been completed, and has been opened and named by our beloved Queen Mary. The new Medical School, surely one of the finest in the country, was opened last May by the Chancellor of the University of London. The culmination of our task is the splendid Hospital building which your Majesties see to-day. The unique planning of the building which is the result of research throughout the country and abroad, and the remarkable attention to detail to ensure economical and efficient administration, have already made it a model for other institutions of its kind. Copies of its plans and of its scheme of administration have been sought by administrators and architects in this country and abroad.

I desire to record, and to acknowledge with gratitude, the cordial co-operation which has existed in the past between the London County Council, the County and City Authorities, and the old Westminster Hospital. I feel sure that this co-operation will continue and develop in the future.

We meet under the happy auspices of Your Majesties' presence, in the company of two thousand of our friends, who have devoted, and will still devote, their money and their time to the support of this Hospital. On such an occasion, may I be permitted, Sire, to express our deep debt of gratitude also to our generous benefactors, and in particular to one who has been the inspiration of us all, our Chairman, Mr. Bernard Docker? We are fully conscious that it is very largely due to his guidance, example and magnificent generosity that this great scheme has been brought to fruition.

While congratulating ourselves on this achievement, let us not forget the symbolic inwardness of today's event. This new home of healing, of pioneering and medical instruction, has been provided by the voluntary gifts of many thousands of people in all parts of the country and Empire. Yet we are only one of a thousand Voluntary Hospitals in England, each carrying on, day and night, their merciful task, and each having its loyal band of voluntary supporters.

The seal of our Hospital portrays the Good Samaritan, and bears the words "Go and do

thou likewise." It is inspiring to think that, even in these difficult days, there are people in every corner of the Empire thus following the words of the Master.

Your Majesty, I am asked by the Governors of Westminster Hospital humbly and respectfully to invite you to declare open the new Westminster Hospital.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

I thank you most cordially for your loyal and dutiful Address, presented on behalf of the Governors and subscribers of the Westminster Hospital. For The Queen and Myself this occasion is one of much interest. As you have said, the Westminster was the first of all the great Hospitals to be founded upon the charitable gifts of the public. Its history has been long and famous and its reputation as a leader of progress is being worthily maintained in our own day. These new buildings incorporate the latest improvements in hospital planning and technique, and I am glad to learn that they are already widely admired.

There are, however, more personal reasons for Our Pleasure in being here today. I am a Patron of the Hospital, and the link with Our Household is a close one, for any member who needs treatment is accommodated in its wards. Moreover, the new Nurses' Home, which was opened by My Mother Queen Mary, now bears her name.

To mark the present occasion, I have agreed that the Children's Wings of the new Hospital should bear the names of My Daughters, and be known as "The Princess Elizabeth Wing" and "The Princess Margaret Rose Wing."

I am informed that arrangements have been made, in dealing with out-patients, to ensure close co-operation with their own doctors, and in certain special cases with the local authorities. If the best results are to be obtained from the many services, voluntary and public, for the treatment of ill-health, in the Home and in the Hospital and Clinic, co-ordination of this kind is of the greatest importance, and I am happy to learn that this is so well recognized by the authorities of the Westminster Hospital.

The new buildings embody a great ideal. The benefactors, whose generosity has made this achievement possible, and the Committee and Staff, who have for four years devoted so much of their energy and leisure time to its completion, must indeed be gratified to-day, when they look upon the fine result of their efforts. I congratulate them heartily and have great pleasure in declaring the new Westminster Hospital open.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SUB-INSPECTORS OF QUARRIES (MALE) UNDER THE MINES DEPARTMENT.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 40 years of age on that date.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must have had at least five years' recent and practical experience of general quarrying work and must possess a thorough knowledge of conditions in the division in which the vacancy occurs.

6. The Mines Department will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

7. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Mines Department and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office. The candidates' credentials will be examined at the Mines Department and the names of those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be submitted to the Civil Service

Commissioners. The Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Mines Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be admitted to an interview before a Selection Board. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented upon it. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence the Board will frame their decisions, which will be final.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character.

10. An Inspector upon first appointment will be subject to two years' probation. At or before the end of this time he will be required to pass an examination in quarry law which will be qualifying only, not competitive. An Inspector who fails to pass will not be retained in the service unless the Secretary for Mines, for special reasons, should allow another trial.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

12. A selected candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 10s. before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
