THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF HARROW SCHOOL having, on the 14th day of April, 1939, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Clause I of the Statute of the 16th May, 1871, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

HARROW SCHOOL.

A STATUTE for altering Clause I of the Statute of the 16th May 1871 then made for determining and establishing the Constitution of the then New Governing Body of Harrow School by the Special Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the Public Schools Act, 1868.

Whereas by Section 11 of the Public Schools Act 1868 it is enacted that any Statute made in exercise of the powers of that Act may at any time or times after the expiration of the powers of that Act conferred on the Special Commissioners, be repealed or altered by the Governing Body for the time being in the same manner and subject to the same provisions, with the exception of those requiring such Statutes to be submitted to and approved by the Special Commissioners, in and subject to which Statutes may be made by the Governing Body.

And whereas by Clause I of the said Statute of the 16th May 1871 it is provided as follows:—

" 1. The Governing Body of Harrow School shall consist of the following members, namely:—

- " One member to be elected by the Hebdomadal Council of the University of Oxford
- " One member to be elected by the Council of the Senate of the University of Cambridge
- " One member to be elected by the President and Council of the Royal Society
- " One member to be elected by the Lord Chancellor for the time being

" One member to be elected by the Head, Lower and Assistant Masters of the School for the time being

" Two members to be elected by the Keepers and Governors of the possessions revenues and goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon, in the village of Harrow-on-the-Hill, for the time being

" Three members to be elected in the first instance by the Keepers and Governors of the possessions, revenues and goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon, in the village of Harrow-on-the-Hill, and in subsequent cases in manner hereinafter mentioned."

Now we, the Keepers and Governors of the possessions, revenues and goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon within the town of Harrow-on-the-Hill in the County of Middlesex, being the Governing Body of Harrow School for the time being, being desirous of altering Clause 1 of the said Statute of the 16th May 1871, in pursuance of the said Section 11 of the said Public Schools Act 1868, and any and every other power us hereunto enabling do by this Statute enact as follows:—

The Governing Body of Harrow School shall consist of the following members namely:—

Ten members to be elected respectively as mentioned in Clause 1 of the said Statute of the 16th May 1871 and

Such further and additional members as from time to time shall be elected by the Keepers and Governors of the possessions revenues and goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon within the town of Harrow-on-the-Hill in the County of Middlesex for the time being, but so that the total number of members of the said Governing Body shall not at any time exceed fifteen provided that each of the members to be elected by the Keepers and Governors of the possessions, revenues and goods of the Free Grammar School of John Lyon within the town of Harrow-on-the-Hill in the County of Middlesex for the time being after the date when this Statute comes into force (including such of the said ten members as are to be elected by the said Keepers and Governors as well as such further and additional members as aforesaid) shall be elected for a period of five years only but shall thereafter from time to time be eligible for re-election.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th May, 1939, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th May, 1939, to Saturday, the 13th May, 1939, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
