The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. A gentleman presented for the first time may present only his son on the occasion when he himself is presented.

3. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

5. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services, Burma Services, Indian Army and Burma Army, and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for presentation.

6. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers, Officers of the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, Officers of the Auxiliary Air Force Reserve of Officers, and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Under-Secretary of State, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

7. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Department under which they serve.

8. All Officers of the Indian Services, Burma Services, Indian Army and Burma Army,

whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India and Burma Offices, Whitehall.

9. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

10. Gentlemen connected with the Treasury, the Foreign Office, and other Government Departments will make their applications through the Private Secretaries to the Ministers of the respective Departments.

11. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications through the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Home Office.

12. Lord Provosts and Provosts and Conveners of County Councils will make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Scotland, at the Scottish Office, Whitehall.

Scottish Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel and Legal Officials in Scotland should make their applications through the Legal Secretary to the Lord Advocate.

EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L. 168.**

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas the Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 168, issued by the Board of Trade on the 14th July, 1937, as modified by the Board on the 29th November, 1938, permits the exportation of certain aircraft and aircraft engines from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland (including any aerodrome approved by the Secretary of State as a Customs aerodrome under Schedule VIII of the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923) to all destinations other than Spain, Spanish possessions or the Spanish Zone of Morocco;

And whereas it is desirable that the said Open General Export Licence should hereafter apply to all destinations without exception;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby direct and declare that the scope of the said Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 168 is extended with effect from the 10th May, 1939, so as to permit the export of the aircraft and aircraft engines to which the said licence applies to all destinations without exception.

# MODIFICATION OF OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L. 169.

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas the Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 169, issued by the Board of Trade on the 8th June, 1937, permits the exportation of certain smooth bore guns and cartridges therefor, certain brands of smokeless gunpowder and certain industrial explosives from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland to all destinations outside certain zones which are set out in the Schedule to the said Licence;

And whereas it is desirable that the said Open General Export Licence should hereafter apply to all destinations in Spain and Spanish possessions wherever situated, other than Ifni, but not to destinations in the Spanish Zone of Morocco;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that behalf, do hereby direct and declare that the scope of the said Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 169 is extended with effect from the 10th May, 1939, so as to permit the export of any goods to which the said licence applies to all destinations outside the special zones (including the Spanish Zone of Morocco) set out in Part I of the Schedule thereto.

# MODIFICATION OF OPEN GENERAL EXPORT LICENCE No. G.L. 170.

Whereas by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, the export of certain goods is prohibited except under a licence of the Board of Trade;

And whereas the holder of a valid firearm certificate issued under Section 1 (1) of the Firearms Act, 1920, or under Section 2 of the Firearms Act, 1937, is authorised by the Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 170, issued by the Board of Trade on the 8th June, 1937 (subject to certain conditions) to export the firearms and ammunition held under the authority of the said certificate from any port in Great Britain or Northern Ireland to all destinations other than Spain, Spanish possessions wherever situated and the Spanish Zone of Morocco;

And whereas it is desirable that the said Open General Export Licence should hereafter apply to all destinations without exception;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in the exercise of all powers enabling them in that

behalf, do hereby direct and declare that the scope of the said Open General Export Licence No. G.L. 170 is extended with effect from the 10th May, 1939, so as to permit (subject to the aforesaid conditions) the holder of any valid firearm certificate as aforesaid to export the firearms and ammunition held under the authority of the said certificate to all destinations without exception.

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHED SITUATIONS OF (1) EX-SOLDIER CLERK, GRADE B, IN THE WAR OFFICE, AND (2) DEPARTMENTAL CLERK (GRADE IV) IN WAR DEPARTMENT OUTSTATION OFFICES.**

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The upper limit of age for these situations is 49, and candidates must be under that age on the first day of the month in which the competition is held.

2. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

**3. ARMY SERVICE.**

(a) *Serving Soldiers* serving at home and abroad must, on the 1st January of the year in which the examination is held—

(i) have completed not less than 11 years with the Colours after attaining the age of 18 years, and

(ii) be serving in their last year of service of current engagement.

Serving soldiers declared successful at an examination will, subject to their satisfying the conditions prescribed in these Regulations, be appointed to vacancies as they occur after discharge from Army service, provided that discharge is carried out within 12 months from the date of the examination at which they are successful.

(b) *Ex-Soldiers* must, on the first day of the month in which the examination is held—

(i) have been discharged from the Army after not less than 12 years' service with the Colours after attaining the age of 18 years, or have been invalided out of the Army, and

(ii) have left the Colours not more than two years. This period may be extended to three years in the case of those candidates, otherwise eligible under these Regulations, who since discharge from the Colours have been employed in a temporary clerical capacity in the War Office or War Department Outstation Offices.

(c) All candidates must be in possession of at least a 1st Class Certificate of Education and have an Army Character assessed at not less than "Very Good". Candidates exempted under War Office authority from obtaining a 1st Class Certificate will, if otherwise eligible, be regarded as eligible under this sub-paragraph.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

5. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and if he has been invalided out of the Army after less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces he must also be the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the War Office is required before a candidate either of whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth can be appointed.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

7. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

English.

Arithmetic.

General Knowledge.

Candidates will be required to obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Candidates declared successful at the examination will, so far as vacancies permit, be given the option of electing the appointment either of Ex-Soldier Clerk, Grade B, in the War Office or of Departmental Clerk, Grade IV, in the War Department Outstation Offices.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of £1 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.
