"And whereas we find it expedient that recruitment into the Royal Naval Reserve should cease on mobilisation, entry into the Patrol Service being solely by way of engagement in the Royal Navy for the period of hostilities only, and we consider it desirable that Petty Officers of the Seaman and Stoker Branches who may be so recruited shall be given titles and rates of pay identical with those of Second Hands and Enginemen in the Royal Naval Reserve as authorised by Order in Council of 3rd November, 1927:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the entry of such ratings accordingly with the titles and rates of pay set forth in the annexed schedule.

All those parts of the Counties of Berks, Surrey, Sussex and Southampton lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, track, waterway or railway line is named as a boundary, such road, track, waterway or railway line:—

On the North, from the point at Henley-on-Thames where the Henley-on-Thames-Maidenhead road crosses the River Thames, down the River Thames, first northwards along Henley Reach, thence generally eastwards through Hambleden Lock, Hurley and Bisham to Cookham.

On the East, from this point southwards along the River Thames through Bray to the ferry at Monkey Island; thence southwards along the road which crosses the Maidenhead-Windsor road one mile south-east of Bray, past the Hare and Hounds Inn to the road junction at Newlodge farm; thence eastwards along the road to New Lodge; thence south-eastwards along the road skirting Windsor Forest to the road junction just north-west of King's Mead; thence south-westwards from this point along the road by Winkfield Lodge and Brookside House, through Heatherdown to the point where this road joins the Bracknell-Sunninghill road $\frac{3}{4}$ -mile west of the Royal Ascot Hotel; thence eastwards along the road towards Chertsey through Sunninghill to the point where the road crosses the Southern Railway line at Virginia Water Station; thence eastwards along the Southern Railway line to Chertsey Station; thence south-westwards along the road through Ottershaw to Woking Station; thence southwards along the Southern Railway line to Guildford; thence southwards along the road through Godalming, Milford, Brook, Haslemere and Fernhurst to the point where this road joins the Petersfield-Midhurst road at Midhurst.

On the South, from this point westwards along the road through Trotton, Rogate, Sheet and Petersfield to the road junction at Langrish; thence north-westwards along the road through Privett and West Tisted to Ropley; thence

north-westwards along the road across the Southern Railway line, through Sutton Beech Wood and Bighton, to the point where the track from Nettle Beds Farm joins the road at Bighton; thence north-westwards along this track to the point where it joins the Wield-Old Alresford road $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile north-west of Nettle Beds Farm; thence south-westwards along the road to the road junction about one mile north of Old Alresford.

On the West, from this point northwards along the road across Bugmore Hill through Preston Candover, Nutley and Cliddesden to Basingstoke Station; thence northwards along the Great Western Railway line through Stratfield Mortimer to the point where the line passes under the Stratfield Mortimer-Reading road about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles north-east of Stratfield Mortimer; thence north-eastwards along the road through Grazeley to the point where this road meets the Reading County Borough boundary at Great Lea Common; thence generally north-eastwards along the Reading County Borough boundary to the point where it meets the County boundary on the River Thames $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile south-east of Caversham; thence generally north-eastwards down the River Thames through Sonning to Henley-on-Thames.

Which Area surrounded on all sides by a continuous red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Northern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1924 (hereinafter called the Principal Order) accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1939.

2. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 30 of the Principal Order—

“30A. Subject to the provisions of any Ordinance, an appeal shall lie from the High Court to the Rhodesian Court of Appeal.”

3. Article 31 of the Principal Order shall be amended by substituting for the words “from the High Court to His Majesty in Council” the words “to His Majesty in Council from a judgment of the Rhodesian Court of Appeal given on appeal from the High Court”.

4. Nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of the Principal Order under which an appeal lies to His Majesty in Council from a judgment of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia if such judgment has been given before the date of the coming into operation of this Order.

5. His Majesty in Council may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

6. This Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation published in the Gazette.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Northern Rhodesia (Privy Council Appeals) Order in Council, 1913 (hereinafter called the Principal Order) accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Privy Council Appeals) Order in Council, 1939.

2. Section 1 of the Principal Order shall be amended by substituting for the definition of “Court” the following definition—

“‘Court’ means either the Rhodesian Court of Appeal when exercising jurisdiction in appeals from Northern Rhodesia or one or more Judges of the said Court when exercising such jurisdiction, according as the matter in question is one which, under the rules and practice of the Rhodesian Court of Appeal, properly appertains to the Court or to one or more Judges thereof”.

3. Section 3 of the Principal Order shall be amended by substituting for the words “presiding judge” the words “senior member of the Court or, in his absence, of the member of the Court next in seniority”.

4. Nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of the Principal Order under which an appeal lies to His Majesty in Council from a judgment of the High Court of Northern Rhodesia if such judgment has been given before the date of the coming into operation of this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation published in the Gazette.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the Colony of Aden has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within the Colony of Aden of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the Colony of Aden.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of March, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the re-endowment of the Bishopric of Portsmouth:

"Whereas the investments and property which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written are now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Portsmouth:

"And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Portsmouth:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Portsmouth of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

"And whereas the Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Finance, the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, being the Bishop for the time being of a contributory bishopric the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the Cathedral Council of the Cathedral Church of Saint Thomas of Canterbury, Portsmouth, have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund a fixed annual sum of £3,132 to the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and to

his successors in the same Bishopric as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, subject however to the provisions mentioned in Clause 9 of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 22nd day of March, 1928, relating to the constitution of the said Bishopric such annual sum to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment: Provided always that, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, none of the trusts and provisions from which the said investments and property are hereby freed and discharged shall attach to the said annual sum of £3,132, save and except the primary trust for the endowment or benefit of the said Bishopric.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, now Bishop of Carlisle, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parishes of Aldington, West Blatchington, and Hangleton and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Aldington, of the said Parish of West Blatchington, of the said Parish of Hangleton, and of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, the Reverend Brian William Isaac, of Falcon Court, 32, Fleet Street, in the City of London, the Reverend Canon Stephen Mortimer Warner, of Holy Trinity Vicarage, Eastbourne, in the said County of Sussex, the Reverend Canon Charles Askwith, of Saint Matthew's Rectory, Saint Leonards-on-Sea, in the said County of Sussex, and the Reverend Edward Frederick Yorke, of Saint Luke's Vicarage, Old Shoreham Road, Brighton, in the said County of Sussex, as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Aldrington, of the said Parish of West Blatchington, of the said Parish of Hangleton, and of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The

District of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove.'

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, Hove, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Aldrington, of the Parish of West Blatchington, of the Parish of Hangleton and of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, all in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which taken together are bounded upon all sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Hove, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, at the junction of Sackville Road with Old Shoreham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Old Shoreham Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Hove Park, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of the roadway leading to West Blatchington, and extending thence first northward to and then north-westward along the middle of the said roadway (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, from the New Parish of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton, in the said County and Diocese) for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Agnes, Hove, from the said Parish of West Blatchington, and extending thence south-westward along such boundary (thereby following the western side of Nevill Road) for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point at the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Birmingham, Immanuel, both of which Benefices are situate

in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Birmingham, Saint Thomas and Birmingham, Immanuel, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Birmingham and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Birmingham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the approval of the said Bishop of Birmingham embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said two Benefices of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, and Birmingham, Immanuel, are at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, and Birmingham, Immanuel, now belongs to one and the same body of Trustees:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, and the said Benefice of Birmingham, Immanuel, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Birmingham, Saint Thomas' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice) and that the parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the

United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £100 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Birmingham, Immanuel,) shall be constituted a fund towards meeting the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate which fund of £100 per annum shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same towards the stipend of the said Curate.

"6.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (2) for and towards the cost of the provision of a site for and the erection of a Church for a new District (to be in the patronage of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Birmingham, Saint Thomas, and Birmingham, Immanuel), within one of the new housing areas in or near the City of Birmingham, and the residue of such net proceeds shall be applied for and towards the cost of the provision of a site or sites for and the erection of another or other Churches in the vicinity of the City of Birmingham to be selected by the Bishop of Birmingham.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Thomas, Birmingham, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Birmingham and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, or such of them as the Bishop of Birmingham shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Birmingham for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Birmingham which the

Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Immanuel, Birmingham, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Birmingham to be equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 7. And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.
