- (ii) the Michaelmas Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall begin on the 3rd day of October; and
- (iii) the Long Vacation of the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes begin on the 29th day of July and end on the 2nd day of October.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Long Vacation (1939) Order, 1939.

WHEREAS under section six of the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act ''), His Majesty has power by Order in Council to direct that the provisions of the Act shall, subject to such modifications and adaptations, to be specified in the Order, as appear to His Majesty necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case, apply to ships registered in any British possession outside the United Kingdom, other than the Dominions mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act, and in any territory under His Majesty's protection and in any territory in respect of which a mandate has been accepted by His Majesty, other than any such territory in respect of which the mandate is being exercised by the Government of any of the Dominions mentioned in the said Second Schedule, as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping (Colonies) Order, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), the provisions of the Act, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the principal Order, were applied to ships registered in the Colonies mentioned in the principal Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the principal Order, apply to ships registered in the Gambia and the British Solomon Islands Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

- I. The principal Order shall have effect as if in Section I there were substituted for the word "Colonies" the word "territories", and for the word "Colony" the word "territory", and as if there were added to the Schedule "The Gambia" and "British Solomon Islands Protectorate".
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Colonies) (Amendment) Order, 1939.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of April, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of North Stoneham, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of North Stoneham has been improved under and by virtue of a sale of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice which sale was carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the present Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham:

'And whereas the proceeds of the said sale have been invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, in a sum of £5,000 £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock and a sum of £5,614 os. 8d. £3 per centum per annum Redemption Stock 1986-96 which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sale payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sale exceeds the annual sum of £300, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be in excess of £600:

"And whereas the Reverend Harold Gordon Peile is the present Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Stoneham:
