WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Act, 1937, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 5th day of May, 1939, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, K.G., K.T., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the

Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of March, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hatford and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stanford in the Vale both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Kenneth Escott, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hatford and Stanford in the Vale duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said Benefices and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Oxford embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Hatford and Stanford in the Vale are now full

being held together in plurality by the Reverend Canon Edwin Farmer under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Kenneth Escott, Bishop of Oxford, and of the said Edwin Farmer (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Hatford and the said Benefice of Stanford in the Vale shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stanford in the Vale with Hatford' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edwin Farmer if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Hatford and Stanford in the Vale shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stanford in the Vale shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the first vacation of the United Benefice provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely a part producing £100 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Hatford pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be constituted a fund towards meeting the cost of providing for the services of the said Curate or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £100 per annum shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same towards the stipend of the said Curate or the expenses of occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the

union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Stanford in the Vale shall have the first, the third and the fifth turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hatford shall have the second and the fourth turns.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved on behalf of His Majesty at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf, are pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And, by and with the like advice, are pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Gratwich and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kingstone both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Gratwich and Kingstone with a part of the United Benefice of Uttoxeter with Bramshall situate in the said County of Stafford and in the said Diocese of Lichfield duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Gratwich and Kingstone and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Gratwich and Kingstone and the Parish of Uttoxeter being one of the Parishes of the said United Benefice of Uttoxeter with Bramshall and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Gratwich and Kingstone are at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices of Gratwich and Kingstone now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Gratwich and the said Benefice of Kingstone shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kingstone with Gratwich', but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gratwich shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That with the consent of the Reverend Wilfrid Edward Charlton, being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Uttoxeter with Bramshall (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (a) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Gratwich, all that adjacent part of the said Parish of Uttoxeter which is bounded upon the north-west by the imaginary line which divides the Civil Parish of Field from the Civil Parish of Uttoxeter Rural, upon the north-east by an imaginary line following the middle of Carry Lane to its junction with the road leading from Uttoxeter to Stafford, and upon the south by an imaginary line following the middle of the said road leading from Uttoxeter to Stafford, all which part of the said Parish of Uttoxeter is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured green, and (b) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Kingstone, all those further parts of the said Parish of Uttoxeter adjacent to the said Parish of Kingstone which are bounded upon the north by an imaginary line following the middle of the said road leading from Uttoxeter to Stafford to its junction at Blount's Green with the road leading to Abbots Bromley and upon the east by an imaginary line following the middle of the said road leading from Blount's Green to Abbots Bromley all which parts of the said Parish of Uttoxeter are more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and are thereon coloured yellow.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the

provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lichfield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf affirm the said Scheme and order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and do further order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of May, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, and partly out of the Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory, both in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, together with the said Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas a capital sum of £4,000 has been contributed and paid towards the cost of the erection of a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £4,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as the person to whom they desire that the

whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and the said Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory, both of which, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Hallows, Ipswich.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Hallows, Ipswich, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, which is bounded upon the west partly by the Parish of Saint Mary, Stoke, and partly by the Parish of Wherstead, upon the south-east by the Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory, upon the north-east partly by the consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Ipswich, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Rose Hill, Ipswich, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Rose Hill, Ipswich, from the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, at the junction of Nacton Road with Clapgate Lane, and extending thence southward along the

middle of Clapgate Lane for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Wye Road, and extending thence westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Medway Road, and extending thence southward along the last mentioned wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Cow Pastures Stream, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the said stream under Cliff Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Cliff Lane for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sandy Hill Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Sandy Hill Lane for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Cliff Quay, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Orwell upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, from the said Parish of Saint Mary, Stoke.

"II. And also all the said contiguous Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Saint Clement, Ipswich, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken and to the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich in respect of the said Extra Parochial Place known as Alnesbourn Priory to be comprised within the limits of such District and such Patrons and Incumbent and Bishop have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And do hereby, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

Amendment of Lists of Articles chargeable with Duty under Part I.

(Safeguarding of Key Industries.)

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the lists were therein substituted for that general description.

2. Section 5 (3) of the Finance Act, 1936, provides, amongst other things, that the power of the Board of Trade under sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to issue lists defining articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to that Act shall include power to amend any list so issued.

3. The Board of Trade hereby amend List H issued in 1921 by adding the words "of a purity not less than 95 per cent. excluding moisture" to the items Silver chloride and Silver sulphide.

4. This amendment shall take effect as from the 30th May, 1939.
