## CITY OF LIVERPOOL.

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1936.

BY an Order dated the 19th day of May, 1939, the Minister of Health has repealed the provisions of the Liverpool Corporation Act 1936 hereinafter referred to being provisions which appear to the Minister either to be inconsistent with certain provisions of the Public Health Act 1936 or to have become redundant in consequence of the passing of that Act, namely:—

So much of Section 46 (Byelaws as to provision and maintenance of secondary means of access) as is not repealed by sub-section 3 of Section 55 of the Public Health Act, 1936.

Section 59 (Notice of intention to repair drain).

Sub-sections 2 and 3 of Section 72 (as to common lodging houses).

Section 84 (Extension of Part IV (Verminous premises, etc.) of Public Health Act, 1925).

Section 86 (As to powers of requiring sanitary conveniences for manufactories, etc.).

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

## ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 23rd May, 1939, the Minister of Transport modified and confirmed the County Council of Lancashire Roads (Restriction) Order, 1939, (Clitheroe Borough) made by the Lancashire County Council under Section 46(1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933. The Order as modified provides that, subject to certain exceptions, no person shall drive or cause to be driven any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor or heavy motor car on Church Street, Clitheroe, from its junction with Market Place to its junction with Church Brow, or on Church Brow, Clitheroe, from its junction with Church Street to its junction with Waddington Road and Well Terrace.

## COUNTY BOROUGH OF HALIFAX.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.
