"And whereas the rate of pay of Principal Assistant Secretaries in Your Majesty's Civil Service has been increased to £1,700 a year, inclusive, as from 1st April, 1939.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by

Your Order in Council to authorise that the salary of the Director of Greenwich Hospital shall be at the rate of £1,700 a year, inclusive, as from 1st April, 1939."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas we propose that men holding the existing ratings of Seaman Deep Diver, Diver, First Class, and Diver, Second Class, shall be assimilated to the new grades as we direct, and that men now holding, or undergoing qualifying courses for, the ratings of Artificer Deep Diver, Artificer Diver, First Class, and Artificer Diver, Second Class, shall continue to hold those ratings and to receive the present rates of 1s. 2d., 9d., and 6d., a day respectively, with extra pay for diving work at the rates authorised for Artificer Diver by Order in Council of the 26th June, 1930, so long as they remain efficient in the non-substantive rating, Artificer Divers, Second Class, to continue to be eligible for the rating of Artificer Diver, First Class:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the foregoing.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such

restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 29th of July, 1937, sanction was given *inter alia*, that all men whose First Continuous Service engagement having expired, re-entered or re-engaged for Non-continuous Service under certain emergency and expansion schemes should, provided they are otherwise eligible, count the time as Continuous Service time for Naval Pension and Good Conduct Medal Gratuity as if they had re-engaged in the General Service to complete time for pension:

" And whereas we are of opinion that this condition should apply also to Royal Fleet Reservists who volunteered during the manning emergency for service under the aforesaid schemes or analogous service, which involves discharge from the Reserve (though with the reservation of certain Reserve privileges) and re-entry on an Active Service basis, and that if such men are invalided during the currency of their Active Service engagements, they should be eligible for invaliding gratuity or pension on the Naval scale if more beneficial than proportionate Royal Fleet Reserve Gratuity:

" And whereas we are of opinion that Royal Naval Reservists who volunteered under similar conditions for service under the aforesaid schemes or for analogous service should be eligible for invaliding gratuity or pension on the Naval scale if more beneficial than proportionate Naval Reserve gratuity:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" 1. Royal Fleet Reservists who volunteered for service under the emergency and expansion schemes or for analogous service, and who are otherwise eligible, to be permitted to count time served under their emergency Non-Continuous Service engagements as Continuous Service time for the purposes of the award of Naval pension and the R.N. Long Service and Good Conduct medal and gratuity.

" 2. Royal Fleet and Royal Naval Reservists serving under the schemes referred to in paragraph 1, if invalided during the currency of their Active Service engagements, to be awarded pension and gratuity on the Naval scale, if more beneficial than proportionate Reserve gratuity.

" 3. The same time not to be allowed to reckon for both Reserve gratuity and Naval Pension, or for both Reserve and Active Service medal: Royal Fleet Reservists, however, not to be debarred from counting the same time for both Reserve gratuity and Active Service medal and gratuity."

"An officer of or below the rank of Commander R.N., or Major R.M., qualified in observer duties and serving at the Admiralty to receive an allowance on the following scale, in addition to Admiralty allowance, for any days on which he is required to make duty flights.

Commander R.N., and Major R.M.—
3s. 6d. a day.

Lieutenant-Commander R.N., and Captain R.M., and officers junior to those ranks—
4s. a day."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction, with effect from the 18th May, 1939, the payment of allowances at the rates of—

1s. a week for Chief Petty Officer Apprentices

6d. a week for Petty Officer Apprentices to such Artificer Apprentices and Air Apprentices as are selected to carry out the appropriate duties in a Training Establishment.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

"Lodging Allowance at the rate of 1s. 6d. per diem where quarters cannot be provided for the Instructor except when he is in receipt of marriage allowance and is able to live with his family when a reduced rate of lodging allowance of 6d. a day shall be payable.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 11th day of May, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and

9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Leonard, Marston Green, situate within the Parish of Sheldon, which Parish is partly in the City of Birmingham and partly in the County of Warwick and wholly in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Sheldon and of the Parish of Coleshill, in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Sheldon and of the said Parish of Coleshill should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Leonard, Marston Green, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as Diocesan, and with the consent of Colonel Frederick James Bosworth Wingfield Digby, D.S.O., of Sherborne Castle, in the County of Dorset, as the Patron as well of the Rectory of the said Parish of Sheldon as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Coleshill (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Sheldon and of the said Parish of Coleshill which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Leonard, Marston Green, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Leonard, Marston Green'.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Leonard, Marston Green, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Sheldon, situate partly in the City of Birmingham and partly in the County of Warwick and wholly in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Elmdon, upon the east partly by the Parish of Bickenhill and partly by the Parish of Coleshill, all in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, upon the north partly by the said Parish of Coleshill, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Margaret, Castle Bromwich, in the said City of Birmingham and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, upon the north-west partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint

Margaret, Castle Bromwich, and partly by the Parish of Yardley, in the said City of Birmingham and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Yardley from the said Parish of Sheldon crosses the middle of the Rugby to Birmingham Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the said City of Birmingham, and extending thence generally southward along such City boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sheldon from the said Parish of Elmdon.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Coleshill which is bounded upon the south by the said Parish of Bickenhill, upon the west and upon part of the north by the above described portion of the said Parish of Sheldon, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sheldon from the said Parish of Coleshill at the junction of Kingshurst Brook with the River Cole, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the River Cole for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Bacon's End Bridge, which carries Old Chester Road across the said river, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Old Chester Road for a distance of 1 mile and 47½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Coleshill from the said Parish of Bickenhill."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of West Wickham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Wickham is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir Stephen Arthur Hallam Farnaby Lennard of Number 425, Howe Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, Baronet:

"And whereas the said Stephen Arthur Hallam Farnaby Lennard is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Wickham now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of West Wickham which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of West Wickham:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Stephen Arthur Hallam Farnaby Lennard (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of West Wickham now vested in him, the said Stephen Arthur Hallam Farnaby Lennard as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the

said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Cressage and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sheinton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ And whereas the said Caroline Selina Hervey and the said Caroline Ethel May Hervey, with the consents of the said Kathleen Evelyn Mildred Ann Randall, Winifred Edith Bertha Arrol, John Theodore Lamplugh Hervey and Thomas Alfred Lamplugh Hervey, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Colmer with Priors Dean, now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Winchester for the time being:

“ Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Caroline Selina Hervey, Caroline Ethel May Hervey, Kathleen Evelyn Mildred Ann Randall, Winifred Edith Bertha Arrol, John Theodore Lamplugh Hervey and Thomas Alfred Lamplugh Hervey (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Colmer with Priors Dean, now vested as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.
